
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AND THE UNITED STATES
CONGRESS TO SUPPORT THE CONTINUATION OF THE FEDERAL
RENEWABLE ENERGY TAX CREDITS.

1 WHEREAS, Hawaii's dependence on petroleum is the highest in
2 the nation, accounting for approximately ninety per cent of the
3 State's energy needs; and
4

5 WHEREAS, Hawaii's high petroleum dependence makes consumers
6 extremely vulnerable to any oil embargo, supply disruption,
7 international market dysfunction, and many other factors beyond
8 the State's control; and
9

10 WHEREAS, for the sake of the State's energy security, as
11 well as the potential economic and environmental benefits of
12 increasing energy self-sufficiency, developing renewable energy
13 resources is critically important; and
14

15 WHEREAS, the State has committed to a renewable energy
16 standard, which requires twenty per cent of electricity sold to
17 be generated from renewable resources by the end of 2020; and
18

19 WHEREAS, the State has entered into a memorandum of
20 understanding with the United States Department of Energy to
21 meet a goal of seventy per cent renewable energy production for
22 the State by 2030; and
23

24 WHEREAS, the State has sought to encourage private sector
25 development of renewable energy projects; and
26

27 WHEREAS, the existing federal solar energy investment tax
28 credit of thirty per cent for homeowners and businesses and the
29 federal production tax credit of \$0.02 per KWh for wind
30 ("federal renewable energy tax credits") are a significant



1 inducement to private sector development of renewable energy
2 projects; and

3

4 WHEREAS, however, these existing federal renewable energy
5 tax credits are scheduled to expire at the end of 2008; and

6

7 WHEREAS, the federal renewable energy tax credits enables
8 utilities, wind energy developers, and manufacturers to invest
9 billions of dollars each year in equipment and facilities
10 associated with the generation of electricity from renewable
11 energy resources, such as wind, geothermal, biomass, and
12 hydropower; and

13

14 WHEREAS, investment decisions are being made today for new
15 renewable energy power projects that are not expected to be
16 completed this year; and

17

18 WHEREAS, if Congress does not act promptly to extend the
19 federal renewable energy tax credits, many companies are
20 expected to stop making investments in renewable energy projects
21 not expected to be completed before the end of the year; now,
22 therefore,

24 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
25 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
26 Session of 2008, the Senate concurring, that in recognition of
27 Hawaii's need for energy security and self-sufficiency, the
28 President of the United States and members of the Congress of
29 the United States are urged to support the continuation of the
30 federal renewable energy tax credits; and

32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the President of the
34 United States, the President and the Majority Leader of the
35 United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of
36 Representatives, and the members of Hawaii's congressional
37 delegation.
