
HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO EXPAND ITS TEEN PREGNANCY EDUCATION PROGRAM AND ENCOURAGING COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS TO TRAIN YOUTH GROUPS TO EDUCATE AND RAISE AWARENESS AMONG TEENS ABOUT TEEN PREGNANCY.

1 WHEREAS, teen pregnancy in Hawaii is a great concern
2 throughout the State; and

3
4 WHEREAS, approximately 3,600 teen pregnancies occur a year
5 in Hawaii; and

7 WHEREAS, Hawaii ranks twelfth in the nation in the number
8 of teen pregnancies; and

9
10 WHEREAS, education and awareness are key in preventing
11 unwanted teen pregnancies; and

12
13 WHEREAS, the Department of Education can play a significant
14 role in educating teens about teen pregnancy; and

15
16 WHEREAS, community groups can also play an important role
17 in providing training to youth groups whom, in turn, can educate
18 others and spread awareness; now, therefore,

20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the
21 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular
22 Session of 2008, the Senate concurring, that the Department of
23 Education is requested to expand the peer education program and
24 train peers in providing advice relating to sex and sexuality in
25 order to prevent unwanted teen pregnancies; and

27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is
28 further requested to train faculty to talk with teens about sex
29 and teen pregnancy; and

1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is
 2 also requested to support a program of peer presenters who can
 3 speak to classes about the issue of teen pregnancy; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that community organizations with
 6 expertise in teen pregnancy are encouraged to offer training to
 7 youth groups like the Honolulu Community Action Program's Youth
 8 Advisory Council and other interested groups on how to educate
 9 and bring awareness to teens on the issue of teen pregnancy; and

11 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this
 12 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Superintendent of
 13 Education, the Director of Human Services, the Honolulu
 14 Community Action Program, and the Hawaii Youth Services Network.
