RELATING TO MOPEDS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 291C-195, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$291C-195 Driving of mopeds. (a) No person less than
- 4 fifteen years of age shall drive a moped on a highway, street,
- 5 roadway, or any other public property in the [State.] state. No
- 6 person less than eighteen years of age shall drive a moped
- 7 unless the person wears a safety helmet securely fastened with a
- $oldsymbol{8}$ chin strap. The safety helmet shall meet the specifications and
- 9 requirements established by rules adopted by the director.
- 10 (b) No person shall drive a moped except while sitting
- 11 astride the seat, facing forward, with one leg on each side of
- 12 the moped.
- (c) No person shall drive a moped which is carrying any
- 14 other person nor shall any person other than the driver ride
- 15 upon a moped.
- 16 (d) Subsections (b) and (c) shall not apply to three-
- 17 wheeled mopeds designed to carry a driver and passenger seated
- 18 side by side.

7	a speed less than the normal speed of traffic moving in the same
8	direction at such time shall ride as near to the right side of
9	the roadway as practicable, exercising due care when passing a
10	standing vehicle or one proceeding in the same direction, except
11	under any of the following situations:
12	(1) When preparing for a left turn at an intersection or
13	into a private road or driveway, except where
14	prohibited by official traffic-control devices;
15	(2) When reasonably necessary to avoid conditions
16	(including, but not limited to fixed or moving
17	objects, vehicles, bicycles, pedestrians, animals,
18	surface hazards, or substandard width lanes) that make
19	it unsafe to continue along the right-hand curb or
20	edge; <u>and</u>
21	(3) When a roadway is designated and signposted to carry
22	traffic in one direction only and has two or more

- "[f] §291C-197[f] Driving mopeds on bicycle lanes and

 paths. (a) Wherever bicycle lanes are provided on the roadway,

 moped drivers shall use such bicycle lanes.
- (b) The director of transportation by rule and the

 counties by ordinance may with respect to bicycle paths under

 their respective jurisdictions restrict or prohibit the use of

 such bicycle paths by mopeds. Signs clearly visible to an

Exempts certain three-wheeled mopeds from seating and passenger restrictions on the operation of mopeds. Requires liability and property damage insurance on three-wheeled mopeds. Restricts three-wheeled mopeds to roadways with speed limits of 35 mph or less. (HB931 CD1)
