HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE ON THE IMPACTS OF LOCATING A REDEMPTION CENTER OR REVERSE VENDING MACHINES ON THE PREMISES OF EVERY DEALER THAT SELLS DEPOSIT BEVERAGES.

WHEREAS, the deposit beverage container program has been 1 successful in encouraging businesses and residents of Hawaii to 2 increase recycling of aluminum and plastic beverage containers; 3 4 and 5 WHEREAS, the deposit beverage container program has also 6 been successful in reducing the amount of solid waste material 7 entering the State's landfills; and 8 9 WHEREAS, there are many redemption centers for redeeming 10 deposit beverage containers throughout the State, but not all of 11 them are conveniently located or have convenient hours to 12 encourage all consumers to use them; and 13 14 WHEREAS, not all dealers that sell deposit beverages are 15 required to operate a redemption center or provide reverse 16 vending machines; and 17 18 WHEREAS, it is important to make the redemption of deposit 19 beverage containers as convenient as possible to encourage the 20 greatest number of participants in the deposit beverage 21 container program; now, therefore, 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 24 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 25 Session of 2008, that the Department of Health is requested to 26 report on the likely impacts of requiring the locating of a 27 redemption center or reverse vending machines on the premises of 28 every dealer that sells deposit beverages; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 31 requested to submit its report, including any findings, 32 recommendations, and any proposed legislation, to the 33



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Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of
the Regular Session of 2009; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Director of Health, who in turn is requested to transmit copies to any third party that the Department of Health has contracted to administer any part of the deposit beverage container program.
