## HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO PREPARE A PLAN TO REDUCE THE STATEWIDE FERAL PIG POPULATION.

1 WHEREAS, during the Regular Session of 2006, the 2 Legislature adopted House Resolution No. 98, H.D. 2, S.D. 1 3 (2006), which acknowledged that feral pigs are an invasive 4 species that damage the environment and threaten the survival of 5 native forests birds and other species; and

7 WHEREAS, the migration of feral pigs from state land to 8 residential areas has caused property damage and disturbances 9 that effect the health, safety, and welfare of area residents; 10 and

12 WHEREAS, in connection with its duty to manage and 13 administer forests, forest reserves, public hunting areas, and 14 natural areas, the Department of Land and Natural Resources has 15 attempted to control feral pig populations by scheduled hunting 16 seasons; and

18 WHEREAS, despite an increase in the feral pig population 19 and the corresponding environmental damage in residential areas 20 such as Manoa and Tantalus, the Department of Land and Natural 21 Resources has shortened the feral pig hunting season, allowing 22 the population to remain steady, if not increase; and

24 WHEREAS, by House Resolution No. 98, H.D. 1, S.D. 1 (2006),
25 Legislature requested the Department of Land and Natural
26 Resources to prepare a plan to identify areas where feral pigs
27 are a problem and to reduce the feral pig population; and

29 WHEREAS, any plan developed by the Department of Land and 30 Natural Resources to reduce the feral pig population should 31 include provisions to reimburse private hunters for certain 32 costs incurred in assisting the Department of Land and Natural 33 Resources to control and reduce the feral pig population; now, 34 therefore,
