H.R. NO. 199

HOUSE RESOLUTION

DECLARING THAT THE LAWFULLY ENACTED STATE SOCIAL POLICIES OF THE TWELVE STATES THAT HAVE ENACTED STATE LAWS TO AUTHORIZE THE MEDICAL USE OF MARIJUANA, AND THE ACTIONS OF THOSE LAWFULLY CONFORMING TO THOSE STATE LAWS BY THE USE OF MEDICAL MARIJUANA SHALL NOT BE ENJOINED.

WHEREAS, by prohibiting seriously ill persons from using 1 cannabis in states that have approved such use, the Controlled 2 Substances Act, Title II of the Comprehensive Drug Abuse 3 Prevention and Control Act of 1970, interferes with the rights 4 reserved to the states by the Ninth Amendment of the United 5 States Constitution to enact and implement laws protecting the 6 health, safety, and welfare of their citizens; and 7 8 WHEREAS, the Controlled Substances Act also violates 9 traditional notions of state sovereignty protected by the Tenth 10 Amendment of the United States Constitution; and 11 12 WHEREAS, much time has passed since 1970 when the 13 Controlled Substances Act first classified marijuana as a 14 Schedule I drug, including the emergence of the AIDS epidemic 15 and the accumulation of solid scientific evidence that marijuana 16 can relieve the suffering of those afflicted by certain types of 17 illness, including glaucoma, multiple sclerosis, spasticity, 18 severe pain, and nausea induced by the drugs used in 19 chemotherapy and in the treatment of AIDS; and 20 21 WHEREAS, since 1996, twelve states have enacted laws to 22 authorize the use of medical marijuana only for medical 23 purposes; these states do not legalize the general use of 24 marijuana; and 25 26 WHEREAS, the controversy surrounding state-authorized 27 medical use of marijuana has nothing to do with the war on 28 drugs, but is a fundamental concept in a state's right to enact 29 regulations for the health and welfare of its citizens; now, 30 therefore, 31 32



BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 1 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 2 Session of 2008, that this body declares that the lawfully 3 enacted state social policies of the twelve states that have 4 enacted state laws to authorize the medical use of marijuana, 5 and the actions of those individuals who lawfully conform to 6 those state laws in their use of medical marijuana, shall not be 7 enjoined; and 8

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 10 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, the Governors of the 11 states of Alaska, California, Colorado, Maine, Montana, Nevada, 12 New Mexico, Oregon, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Washington, and 13 members of Hawaii's congressional delegation. 14
