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## HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO RECOGNIZE THE SIMULTANEOUS USAGE OF SIGN LANGUAGE AND SPEECH IN PROVIDING FOR THE EDUCATION OF HEARING EXCEPTIONAL CHILDREN.

WHEREAS, the Department of Education has a duty toward 1 exceptional children, as provided for in Chapter 302A, Hawaii 2 Revised Statutes. 3 4 5 WHEREAS, exceptional children may include children, in particular, those who have chromosomal disorders with speech 6 7 difficulties and autism, who require a signed and spoken language to enable them to live normal competitive lives, yet 8 9 the Department of Education does not recognize this critical developmental and educational need of these exceptional 10 children; 11 12 WHEREAS, exceptional children may include children who are 13 deaf or hard-of-hearing who receive sign language instruction 14 and interpreter services to receive a free appropriate public 15 education; 16 17 WHEREAS, exceptional children may include children whose 18 native language is other than English and receive English 19 20 Language Learners intensive language instruction through the public school system to succeed in their educational programs; 21 22 WHEREAS, exceptional children may include children who 23 desire to participate in the Hawaiian language medium education 24 program; now, therefore, 25 26 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 27 28 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, that the Department of Education is urged to 29 30 recognize: 31



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(1) The simultaneous usage of sign language and speech in 1 providing for the education of exceptional children 2 who hear but may have speech difficulties, such as 3 children with Trisomy 21/Down Syndrome or autism; and 4 5 The developmental and educational implications of the 6 (2) special needs of these exceptional children; and 7 8 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education, 9 including the Special Education and Adult and Community 10 Education Programs, in coordination with the Early Intervention 11 Section of the Department of Health, and the American Sign 12 Language Interpreter Education Program and College of Education 13 of the University of Hawaii, is urged to develop: 14 15 A definition for immediate consideration for the (1)16 Department of Education's current process of revising 17 the Hawaii Administrative Rules related to students 18 with disabilities and the Individuals with 19 Disabilities Education Improvement Act of 2004; 20 21 A two-level credential, with consideration of pay 22 (2)incentives, for sign language with speech instruction 23 for hearing exceptional children in all University of 24 Hawaii certificate and degree programs, pre-service, 25 and in-service training for all subjects, including 26 substitute teacher training, related to the 27 development and education of children with 28 disabilities; 29 30 Home training and classroom training for all students, (3) 31 faculty and related personnel, family, and friends of 32 exceptional children who hear but have speech 33 difficulties, including the coordination of: 34 35 Public library resources, such as "Signing (A) 36 Time!", DVD's, and books; 37 38 (B) Public Broadcasting Service-Hawaii; 39 40 (C) Olelo; and 41



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1 On-line sign language instruction resources, such (D) 2 as the Michigan State University Communication 3 Technology Laboratory American Sign Language 4 5 Browser; and 6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education is 7 requested to submit a report of its findings and 8 recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the 9 Legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 10 the Regular Session of 2009; and 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 13 Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of 14 Education, Superintendent of Education, President of the 15 University of Hawaii, Director of Health, and the Chairperson of 16 the Interdepartmental Cluster for Services to Children. 17 18 19 134 20 OFFERED BY:
