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## HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO EXAMINE THE POLICIES, PHILOSOPHIES, AND APPROACHES OF THE INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS WITH REGARDS TO TEACHERS, STAFF, AND ADMINISTRATION AND TO ADOPT, WHERE APPROPRIATE AND APPLICABLE, SUCCESSFUL STRATEGIES TO PROVIDE THE BEST POSSIBLE EDUCATIONAL EXPERIENCE FOR THE CHILDREN OF HAWAII.

WHEREAS, Hawaii has one of the highest per capita rates of 1 2 students that attend independent schools; and 3 4 WHEREAS, many of the independent schools have policies, 5 philosophies, and approaches with regards to teachers, staff, 6 and administration, that differ from the Department of 7 Education; and 8 9 WHEREAS, over the years, complaints about the Department of 10 Education over numerous operational issues have been voiced by teachers, staff, and administrators; and 11 12 WHEREAS, similar complaints have not been voiced by 13 teachers of independent schools, despite the fact that some 14 independent schools pay their teachers less than the public 15 schools, and spend less per pupil than public schools; and 16 17 WHEREAS, a thoughtful examination by the Department of 18 Education of those policies, philosophies, and approaches may 19 20 assist in improving the performance of the Department of Education; now, therefore, 21 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 23 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 24 Session of 2008, that the Department of Education is urged to 25 examine the policies, philosophies, and approaches of 26 27 independent schools with regards to teachers, staff, and administration, and, where appropriate and applicable, adopt 28
