HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE LEGISLATURE TO DECLARE SEPTEMBER AS LANGUAGE ACCESS MONTH.

WHEREAS, Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. § 2000d), provides that "No person in the United States shall, on the ground of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance"; and

8 WHEREAS, according to the 2000 Census, 290,000 of Hawaii's 9 1.2 million people, or approximately twenty-four per cent of the 10 population, speak a language other than English at home; this 11 includes over 250,000 persons who speak an Asian or Pacific 12 Island language; and

14 WHEREAS, for this portion of Hawaii's population for whom 15 English is not their primary language and who have identified 16 themselves as having limited English proficiency, language is a 17 barrier that often prohibits them from fully participating in 18 the community and undermines their efforts to become self-19 sufficient and productive; and

21 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognized and acknowledged that 22 language is a barrier for individuals with limited English 23 proficiency who live in Hawaii and passed Act 290, Session Laws 24 of Hawaii 2006; and

26 WHEREAS, Hawaii's language access law seeks to break down 27 language barriers by requiring every state agency, and any 28 organization that receives state funding and provides services 29 to the public, to "take reasonable steps to ensure meaningful 30 access to services, programs, and activities by limited English 31 proficient persons", free of charge and regardless of what 32 language the person speaks; and

1 WHEREAS, as a result of Hawaii's language access law, the 2 Office of Language Access was established to promote equal 3 access and full participation for persons with limited English 4 proficiency through oversight, coordination, and technical 5 assistance to state and state-funded entities and by reviewing 6 7 and monitoring language access plans; and 8 WHEREAS, the Office of Language Access has promoted 9 language access through education and training to state agencies 10 and state-funded entities and through outreach to the general 11 12 public at community events, conferences, and in public service announcements; and 13 14 WHEREAS, many residents in Hawaii are still unaware of the 15 language access law and of the everyday challenges faced by 16 limited English proficient persons: when a patient sees a 17 doctor and the doctor only speaks English, but the patient 18 speaks only Chinese; when a state social worker meets with a 19 client applying for food stamps and the social worker speaks 20 English and Ilocano, but the client speaks only Marshallese; or 21 when a public school nurse contacts a child's parents and the 22 23 nurse speaks English, but the child's mother speaks only Korean; 24 and 25 26 WHEREAS, ongoing education and efforts are needed to ensure that language access becomes the standard in the provision of 27 government services; and 28 29 30 WHEREAS, declaring a month dedicated to the promotion of language access will allow the Office of Language Access, in 31 conjunction with community organizations, to showcase the 32 language access law, its requirements, and its benefits; now, 33 therefore. 34 35 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 36 Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular 37 Session of 2008, that the Governor is urged to designate 38 September 2008 as Language Access Month to raise awareness of 39 the language access laws and the provision of equal access to 40 state and state-funded government services; and 41
