A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE NATURAL ENERGY LABORATORY OF HAWAII AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 227D, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to re	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§22</u>	7D- Exemptions. (a) The authority shall be exempt
5	from sect	ion 26-35(a)(1), (4), and (5).
6	(b)	The authority shall:
7	(1)	Communicate directly with the governor and the
8		legislature;
9	(2)	Make all decisions regarding employment, appointment,
10		promotion, transfer, demotion, discharge, and job
11		descriptions of all officers and employees of or under
12		the jurisdiction of the authority without the approval
13		of the director of business, economic development, and
14		tourism; provided that the authority shall follow all
15		applicable laws; and

T	(3) Purchase all supplies, equipment, and furniture		
2	without the approval of the director of business,		
3	economic development, and tourism.		
4	(c) This section shall not apply to any of the authority's		
5	powers or actions related to the Center of Excellence for		
6	Research in Ocean Sciences."		
7	SECTION 2. Section 227D-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
8	amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:		
9	"(b) The governing body of the authority shall consist of		
10	a board of directors having [eleven] thirteen voting members.		
11	[Three] Five members [from the general public] shall be		
12	appointed by the governor for staggered terms pursuant to		
13	section 26-34 $[-7]$. Two of these members shall be selected by the		
14	governor from among the tenants holding leases on property		
15	within the natural energy laboratory of Hawaii authority		
16	research and technology park; provided that tenant members shall		
17	be recused from voting on issues relating to water rates or		
18	lease rents. The remaining three shall be selected from the		
19	general public, except that one [of these members] shall be a		
20	resident of the county of Hawaii[. The members shall be		
21	selected], on the basis of their knowledge, interest, and proven		

- 1 expertise $in[\tau]$ but not limited to $[\tau]$ one or more of the
- 2 following fields: finance, commerce and trade, corporate
- 3 management, marketing, economics, engineering, energy
- 4 management, real estate development, property management,
- 5 aquaculture, and ocean science. The chairperson and secretary
- 6 of the research advisory committee shall serve on the board.
- 7 The director of business, economic development, and tourism, the
- 8 chairperson of the board of land and natural resources, the
- 9 president of the University of Hawaii, the mayor of the county
- 10 of Hawaii, an appointed member from the board of the high
- 11 technology development corporation, and an appointed member from
- 12 the board of the Hawaii strategic development corporation, or
- 13 their designated representatives, shall serve as ex officio,
- 14 voting members of the board. The director of business, economic
- 15 development, and tourism shall serve as the chairperson until
- 16 such time as a chairperson is elected by the board from the
- 17 membership. The board shall elect other officers as it deems
- 18 necessary.
- 19 On issues relating to lease rents or water rates, an
- 20 affirmative vote of seven members shall be required to decide
- 21 the issue."

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- 1 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 4 provided that section 1 shall be repealed on July 1, 2013.

Report Title:

Natural Energy Laboratory of Hawaii Authority; Board of Directors

Description:

Allows the natural energy laboratory of Hawaii authority (NELHA) to communicate directly with governor and legislature and make employment decisions and purchase supplies, equipment, and furniture without DBEDT approval, with the exception of actions in regard to the center of excellence for research in ocean sciences. Increases from eleven to thirteen, the number of members on the board; increases from three to five, the number of public members, with two of them selected from tenants of NELHA and three from the general public; prevents the tenant members from voting on lease rent or water rate issues; and requires a super majority vote of seven members to make decisions on lease rent or water rate issues.
