SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THAT THE LEGACY LAND CONSERVATION COMMISSION RECOMMEND TO THE BOARD OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES THAT THE LAND DESCRIBED AS THE NORTH SHORE HERITAGE PARK ON MAUI HAS VALUE AS A RESOURCE TO THE STATE AND SHOULD BE ACQUIRED BY THE STATE AS LEGACY LANDS.

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Approximately 26 acres known as Stable Road Beach 1 (6) which is described as TMK II 3-8-01, parcel 3; and 2 3 WHEREAS, there is great concern that the lands making up 4 5 the North Shore Heritage Park are susceptible to development; and 6 7 WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the State and its 8 9 residents to maintain the North Shore Heritage Park in an 10 undeveloped state which would provide for access to public beaches and open spaces; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, the North Shore Heritage Park has value as a 14 resource of the State and should be acquired by the State as legacy lands; and 15 16 WHEREAS, the initial step required in order to have the 17 18 State acquire the North Shore Heritage Park as legacy lands is to have the Legacy Land Conservation Commission recommend such 19 an acquisition to the Board of Land and Natural Resources; now, 20 21 therefore, 22 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 23 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the 24 House of Representatives concurring, that the Legacy Land 25 Conservation Commission is urged to identify the North Shore 26 Heritage Park as lands which have value as a resource to the 27 State; and 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Legacy Land Conservation 30 Commission is urged to recommend to the Board of Land and 31 32 Natural Resources that the North Shore Heritage Park be acquired by the State as legacy lands in order to preserve open spaces 33 and access to public beaches; and 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 36 37 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Legacy Land Conservation Commission, the Board of Land and Natural 38 39 Resources, and the Department of Land and Natural Resources. 40 41 42 <u>a.</u> OFFERED BY:
