SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE JUDICIARY TO CONDUCT FAMILY COURT PROCEEDINGS AT THE KAPOLEI COURT COMPLEX WITH THE CONSENT OF THE AFFECTED PARTIES OR UNLESS ONE OF THE PARTIES COMMENCES THE FAMILY COURT PROCEEDING AT THE KAPOLEI COURT COMPLEX.

WHEREAS, the current amount of available space in the First 1 2 Judicial Circuit for its courts and programs is insufficient to meet the needs of its courts and programs; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the lack of available space is particularly 5 challenging during Family Court matters where emotionally 6 charged parties in child custody and divorce proceedings are 7 crowded into close quarters or forced to wait in a congested 8 area outside the courtroom; and 9 10 WHEREAS, in 2005, the Hawaii State Judiciary received the 11 first of several appropriations to build a new court complex and 12 13 juvenile detention facility in Kapolei; and 14 WHEREAS, groundbreaking for the construction of the future 15 10.97 acre Kapolei Court Complex occurred on July 17, 2007; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS, the tentative completion date for the Kapolei Court Complex is the end of 2009; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, the Kapolei Court Complex is expected to contain 22 over one hundred thousand square feet and accommodate District, Family, and Circuit Court functions; and 23 24 WHEREAS, the Hawaii State Judiciary has proposed that all 25 Family Court matters be conducted at the Kapolei Court Complex; 26 anđ 27 28 29 WHEREAS, however, opponents of this proposal state that it is not fair for residents of areas such as Honolulu, Kakaako, 30

Waikiki, and Waimanalo to commute to Kapolei for their Family 1 2 Court proceedings; and 3 4 WHEREAS, it is likely that the commute to the Kapolei Court 5 Complex will have the greatest detrimental impact on low-income Family Court parties; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, this is due, in part, to the additional 9 transportation expenses that they will incur for themselves and 10 their legal counsel, as well as, the logistics of getting back to work or fulfilling other commitments like picking children up 11 12 from school: and 13 14 WHEREAS, the First Judicial Circuit should provide parties with the option of conducting their Family Court proceedings at 15 the Kapolei Court Complex or at the existing Family Court 16 facility; now, therefore, 17 18 19 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 20 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the 21 House of Representatives concurring, that the Judiciary is 22 requested to conduct Family Court proceedings at the Kapolei 23 Court Complex with the consent of the affected parties or unless one of the parties commences the Family Court proceeding at the 24 Kapolei Court Complex; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 27 28 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chief Justice of the 29 Hawaii Supreme Court. 30 31 32 OFFERED BY:
