## SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT A COMPREHENSIVE MANAGEMENT AUDIT OF THE INSTITUTIONAL BIOSAFETY COMMITTEE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII AT MANOA AND THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE IN RELATION TO HUMAN AND ANIMAL PATHOGENS IMPORTED TO HAWAII FOR RESEARCH PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Institutional Biosafety Committee at the 1 University of Hawaii at Manoa received grants to conduct 2 research related to pathogens from the National Institutes of 3 4 Health; and 5 WHEREAS, the Institutional Biosafety Committee has, for 6 research purposes, oversight over research on human and animal 7 pathogens, such as the avian, West Nile, and dengue flu viruses; 8 9 and 10 WHEREAS, the pathogens received by the Institutional 11 Biosafety Committee are controlled microorganisms that were 12 properly imported into Hawaii through permits granted by the 13 State; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the Institutional Biosafety Committee was not in 16 compliance with the federal guidelines that are required by all 17 institutions that receive grants for biomedical research from 18 19 the National Institutes of Health; and 20 WHEREAS, the Sunshine Project, a private international 21 group that seeks controls on biological weapons, appropriately 22 submitted numerous requests for copies of the minutes from the 23 Institutional Biosafety Committee; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the Institutional Biosafety Committee, in 26 27 violation of the National Institutes of Health guidelines, has failed to comply with such requests from the Sunshine Project; 28 and 29 30



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WHEREAS, the Department of Agriculture discovered that 1 researchers from the University of Hawaii have not submitted 2 various records related to pathogens that the researchers have 3 under their control; and 4 5 WHEREAS, over the past fifty years, due to an inefficient 6 7 recordkeeping system, the Department of Agriculture has not properly recorded the location and inventory of hundreds of 8 viruses and microbes that were imported to Hawaii for research 9 10 purposes; and 11 WHEREAS, a comprehensive management audit of the 12 Institutional Biosafety Committee and the recordkeeping system 13 at the Department of Agriculture will help to ensure that the 14 citizens and visitors of Hawaii are protected from pathogens 15 that are imported to Hawaii for research purposes; now, 16 therefore, 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 19 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the 20 House of Representatives concurring, that the Auditor, with the 21 assistance of the Legislative Reference Bureau, is requested to 22 develop specific legislative proposals; and 23 24 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor, with the 25 26 assistance of the Legislative Reference Bureau, is requested to conduct an audit of the Institutional Biosafety Committee at the 27 University of Hawaii at Manoa and the Department of Agriculture 28 to determine the systems, practices, procedures, and staff 29 30 training that should be in place to protect the citizens and visitors in Hawaii and ensure public accountability with respect 31 to programs involving pathogens imported to the State for 32 research purposes, such as avian, West Nile, and dengue viruses; 33 34 and 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Auditor, with the 36 assistance of the Legislative Reference Bureau, is requested to 37 report its findings and recommendations to the Legislature no 38 39 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular Session of 2009; and 40 41 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 42 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor of the 43 State of Hawaii, the Auditor, the President and Chairperson of 44 2008-0420 SCR SMA-3.doc
