SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY, DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO REDIRECT FINANCIAL AND OTHER RESOURCES FROM TOURISM MARKETING TO THE MAINTENANCE AND PRESERVATION OF HAWAII'S BEACHES.

WHEREAS, pollution continues to increase in Hawaii, and 1 neglecting beach maintenance and preservation creates a public 2 3 hazard and makes Hawaii less attractive to tourism; and 4 5 WHEREAS, recreation and park personnel lack sufficient 6 resources for extensive beach sustainability and maintenance projects, and most beach clean-ups are dependent upon the 7 efforts of nonprofit organizations, community service groups, 8 and volunteer workers; and 9 10 WHEREAS, Hawaii's beaches are a main attraction for many of 11 the tourists who visit Hawaii, and the success of the marketing 12 efforts of the tourist industry is directly linked to the 13 14 condition of our beaches; and 15 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Tourism Authority was appropriated 16 \$69.2 million in fiscal year 2006, \$70.7 million in fiscal year 17 2007, and \$87 million, at this time, for fiscal years 2008 and 18 2009; and 19 20 WHEREAS, out of these appropriations, a substantial amount 21 22 is spent on marketing, including \$50.1 million in fiscal years 2006 and 2007, and \$50.7 million, at this time, for fiscal years 23 2008 and 2009; now, therefore, 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 26 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the 27 House of Representatives concurring, that the Hawaii Tourism 28 Authority, Department of Business, Economic Development, and 29 Tourism is encouraged to redirect financial and other resources 30

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from marketing to the maintenance and preservation of Hawaii's 1 beaches; and 2

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 4 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 5 Board of Land and Natural Resources, to the Mayor and the 6 Chairperson of the Council of each county, the President of the 7 Hawaii Tourism Authority, and the Director of the Department of 8 Business, Economic Development, and Tourism. 9
