SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING REAL ESTATE DEVELOPERS, DESIGNERS, AND ARCHITECTS IN HAWAII TO INCORPORATE UNIVERSAL DESIGN PRINCIPLES INTO THE DESIGN OF THEIR REAL ESTATE PROJECTS.

WHEREAS, "universal design" is defined as the design of 1 products and environments to be usable by all people, to the 2 greatest extent possible, without the need for adaptation or 3 specialized design; and 4 5 WHEREAS, universal design involves designing products 6 considering various factors, including but not limited to, 7 aesthetics, engineering options, environmental issues, industry 8 standards, safety concerns, and cost; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the principles of universal design were developed 11 in 1997 at the Center for Universal Design at North Carolina 12 13 State University by a group which included architects, product designers, engineers, and environmental design researchers; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the principles of universal design are: 16 (1) equitable use, (2) flexibility in use, (3) simple and intuitive, 17 (4) perceptible information, (5) tolerance for error, (6) low 18 physical effort, and (7) size and space for approach and use; 19 20 and 21 WHEREAS, in the fields of real estate development and 22 design, universal design includes the incorporation of such 23 features as no step entries, one-story living, wide doorways, 24 wide hallways, and extra floor space; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, the legislature finds that developers and designers of real estate should be encouraged to incorporate the 28 29 principles of universal design into their real estate projects in Hawaii; now, therefore, 30 31



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BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, the House of Representatives concurring, that real estate developers, designers, and architects in Hawaii are encouraged and requested to incorporate the principles of universal design into the design of their real estate projects; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this
