A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OFFENSES AGAINST PUBLIC ORDER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 711-1100, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 ""Equine animal" means an animal of or belonging to the
- 5 family Equidae, including horses, ponies, mules, donkeys, asses,
- 6 burros, and zebras."
- 7 SECTION 2. Section 711-1108.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 8 amended to read as follows:
- 9 "[f] §711-1108.5[f] Cruelty to animals in the first degree.
- 10 (1) A person commits the offense of cruelty to animals in the
- 11 first degree if the person intentionally or knowingly tortures,
- 12 mutilates, or poisons or causes the torture, mutilation, or
- poisoning of any pet animal or equine animal resulting in
- 14 serious bodily injury or death of the pet animal [-] or equine
- 15 animal.
- 16 (2) Subsection (1) shall not apply to:
- 17 (a) Accepted veterinary practices;
