9	(b) The department of human services shall provide a child
10	with a copy of the guiding principles enumerated in subsection
11	(a) when the child is placed in foster care.
12	(c) The family court may issue any necessary orders, sua
13	sponte or on motion of the guardian ad litem, to the department
14	of human services, the department of health, and the department
15	of education to ensure that the guiding principles enumerated in
16	subsection (a) are upheld."
