A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EDUCATION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. (a) The legislature finds the prevalence of
- 2 obesity is at an all-time high among children and adolescents,
- 3 which can lead to the development of life-long heart disease and
- 4 diabetes, among other ailments. The legislature further finds
- 5 that physical activity has also been known to have a beneficial
- 6 effect on the mental health of young people.
- 7 Many health advocates believe that adults acquire and
- 8 establish patterns of health-related behaviors during childhood
- 9 and adolescence. Thus, children who are encouraged to engage in
- 10 regular physical activity in their youth are more likely to
- 11 continue a pattern of physical activity in adulthood that can
- 12 contribute to better overall physical health during their
- 13 lifetime.
- 14 A recent study released by the California department of
- 15 education revealed a direct relationship between academic
- 16 achievement and physical fitness in California's public school
- 17 students. According to the study:

1	(1)	Higher achievement was associated with higher levels
2		of fitness for each grade level measured (fifth,
3		seventh, and ninth);
4	(2)	The relationship between academic achievement and
5		fitness was greater in mathematics than in reading,
6		particularly at higher fitness levels;
7	(3)	Students who met minimum fitness levels in three or
8		more physical fitness areas showed the greatest gains
9		in academic achievement at all three grade levels
10		measured; and
11	(4)	Females demonstrated higher achievement than males,
12		particularly at higher fitness levels.
13	(b)	The purpose of this Act is to combat the growing
14	problem o	f childhood obesity and promote greater physical health
15	among Haw	aii's children and adolescents by requiring all public
16	elementar	y and middle schools to provide physical education
17	instructi	on as follows:
18	(1)	One hundred minutes every ten school days for grades
19		kindergarten through second;
20	(2)	One hundred twenty minutes every ten schools days for
21		grades three through five; and

1	(3) Two hundred twenty five minutes per course, per week		
2	for middle schools;		
3	provided that beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, at least		
4	forty per cent of all elementary schools, grades kindergarten		
5	through six, shall employ a physical education teacher who is		
6	licensed by the Hawaii teacher standards board.		
7	This Act also makes an appropriation to support the		
8	additional resources that schools may require to implement the		
9	curriculum changes described in this Act.		
10	SECTION 2. Chapter 302A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
11	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
12	and to read as follows:		
13	"§302A- Physical education requirements; elementary and		
14	middle schools. Beginning with the 2008-2009 school year, the		
15	course of study in all public elementary and middle schools		
16	shall include instruction in physical education, with an		
17	emphasis on physical activities that are conducive to the health		
18	and vigor of the body and mind, as follows:		
19	(1) One hundred minutes every ten school days for grades		
20	kindergarten through second;		
21	(2) One hundred twenty minutes every ten schools days for		

grades three through five; and



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1	(3) Two hundred twenty five minutes per course, per week		
2	for all middle school students;		
3	provided that the physical education instructional minutes		
4	required shall be exclusive of recesses and lunch periods;		
5	provided further that beginning with the 2008-2009 school year,		
6	at least forty per cent of all elementary schools grades		
7	kindergarten through six shall employ a physical education		
8	teacher who is licensed by the Hawaii teacher standards board."		
9	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
10	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so		
11	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and		
12	the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal		
13	year 2008-2009, to carry out the purposes of this Act.		
14	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department		
15	of education for the purposes of this Act.		
16	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.		
17	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007, and		
18	shall apply to all public schools beginning with the 2008-2009		
19	academic school year.

Physical Education; Curriculum; Elementary and Middle Schools

Description:

Requires the course of study for all public elementary and middle schools to include a specified number of minutes of physical education instruction within a designated time period, beginning with the 2008-2009 school year. Makes an appropriation to support the curriculum changes.
