A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SOCIAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Cash and Counseling
- 2 is a national program sponsored by the Robert Wood Johnson
- 3 Foundation; the United States Department of Health and Human
- 4 Services, Office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and
- 5 Evaluation; and the Administration on Aging. Under the program,
- 6 recipients of medicaid personal care services or home- and
- 7 community-based services receive a flexible monthly allowance
- 8 and decide who to hire and what services they want to receive.
- 9 The program's innovative approach enables participants to
- 10 direct and manage their personal assistance services according
- 11 to their own specific needs. Participants receive counseling
- 12 and fiscal assistance to help them manage their allowance and
- 13 responsibilities. Participants can choose a family member or
- 14 friend, in lieu of an agency worker, to provide the services.
- 15 This enables family caregivers to receive a level of financial
- 16 recognition and support for their efforts and offsets some of

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- 1 the financial sacrifices that family caregivers make to care for
- 2 loved ones.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to require the department of
- 4 human services to develop and implement a cash and counseling
- 5 pilot program.
- 6 SECTION 2. (a) The department of human services shall
- 7 develop and implement a cash and counseling pilot program that:
- 8 (1) Provides a flexible monthly allowance to recipients of
- 9 medicaid personal care services or home- and
- 11 (2) Enables participants to make choices about the
- 12 personal care services or home- and community-based
- services they receive; and
- 14 (3) Provides counseling and fiscal assistance to
- 15 participants to help them manage their allowance and
- responsibilities.
- 17 (b) For purposes of this section, "personal care services"
- 18 means services to assist in bathing, dressing, and feeding;
- 19 performance of toilet and personal hygiene functions; assistance
- 20 with medications that are ordinarily self-administered;
- 21 assistance with mobility and transfer activities; and other

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- 1 household tasks, including chores services, which are related to
- 2 a medical need.
- 3 (c) The department of human services shall:
- 4 (1) Develop the program in consultation with the United
- 5 States Department of Health and Human Services, the
- 6 Administration on Aging, and the Robert Wood Johnson
- 7 Foundation;
- 8 (2) Request any federal funding that may be available for
- 9 the program; and
- 10 (3) Ensure state compliance with federal regulations,
- including any necessary approval from the Centers for
- 12 Medicare and Medicaid Services.
- 13 SECTION 3. The department of human services shall submit
- 14 an interim report to the legislature no later than twenty days
- 15 prior to the convening of the 2008 regular session, and shall
- 16 submit a final report, including any proposed legislation, to
- 17 the legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening
- 18 of the 2009 regular session.
- 19 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general
- 20 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
- 21 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and
- 22 the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal



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- 1 year 2008-2009, for the department of human services to develop
- 2 and implement a cash and counseling pilot program.
- 3 SECTION 5. The sums appropriated in section 4 shall be
- 4 expended by the department of human services for the purposes of
- 5 this Act.

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6 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
