### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE LAND USE COMMISSION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to ensure native 2 Hawaiian representation on the land use commission. The people of the State of Hawaii acknowledged an obligation to the 3 4 indigenous people of Hawaii by ratifying the 1978 constitutional 5 amendment that compelled the creation of the office of Hawaiian affairs. Subsequently, Act 196, Session Laws of Hawaii 1979, 6 formally created the office of Hawaiian affairs. 7 establishing the office of Hawaiian affairs, the legislature 8 specified six purposes of the office. One of the purposes 9 10 empowered the office to: "...Serv[e] as the principal public agency in this State 11 responsible for the performance, development, and 12 coordination of programs and activities relating to native 13 14 Hawaiians and Hawaiians; .... " Section 10-3(3), Hawaii Revised Statutes. 15 16 The legislature also directed in section 10-13.5, Hawaii

Revised Statutes, that: "Twenty per cent of all funds derived

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- 1 from the public land trust...shall be expended by the office"
- 2 for the betterment of the conditions of native Hawaiians.
- 3 The public land trust makes up more than ninety-four per
- 4 cent of all state lands. The sound and prudent management of
- 5 all state lands and coastal resources is of critical importance
- 6 to native Hawaiians both as a revenue source for their self-
- 7 determination and for the preservation of their cultural and
- 8 religious practices. The State's decisions concerning land use
- 9 directly affect native Hawaiians. The office of Hawaiian
- 10 affairs, as the agency charged with the betterment of the
- 11 conditions of native Hawaiians, needs to contribute to the
- 12 State's stewardship over these resources. Such a role furthers
- 13 the original legislative intent mandated in 1979 through section
- 14 10-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 15 This Act provides for the governor to appoint one member of
- 16 the land use commission, which directly affects the management
- 17 of Hawaiian land and coastal zone resources, from a list of
- 18 three nominees submitted by the office of Hawaiian affairs.
- 19 SECTION 2. Section 205-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:
- 21 "\$205-1 Establishment of the commission. There shall be a
- 22 state land use commission, hereinafter called the commission.

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- 1 The commission shall consist of nine members who shall hold no
- 2 other public office and shall be appointed in the manner and
- 3 serve for the term set forth in section 26-34. One member shall
- 4 be appointed from each of the counties and the remainder shall
- 5 be appointed at large; provided that one member shall have
- 6 substantial experience or expertise in traditional Hawaiian land
- 7 usage and knowledge of cultural land practices. At least one
- 8 member of the commission shall be appointed from, and any
- 9 vacancy in that member's place on the board filled from, a list
- 10 of three nominees submitted to the governor by the office of
- 11 Hawaiian affairs. The commission shall elect its chairperson
- 12 from one of its members. The members shall receive no
- 13 compensation for their services on the commission, but shall be
- 14 reimbursed for actual expenses incurred in the performance of
- 15 their duties. Six affirmative votes shall be necessary for any
- 16 boundary amendment.
- 17 The commission shall be a part of the department of
- 18 business, economic development, and tourism for administration
- 19 purposes, as provided for in section 26-35.
- The commission may engage employees necessary to perform
- 21 its duties, including administrative personnel and an executive
- 22 officer. The executive officer shall be appointed by the



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- 1 commission and the executive officer's position shall be exempt
- 2 from civil service. Departments of the state government shall
- 3 make available to the commission such data, facilities, and
- 4 personnel as are necessary for it to perform its duties. The
- 5 commission may receive and utilize gifts and any funds from the
- 6 federal or other governmental agencies. It shall adopt rules
- 7 quiding its conduct, maintain a record of its activities and
- 8 accomplishments, and make recommendations to the governor and to
- 9 the legislature through the governor."
- 10 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 11 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval,
- 12 and shall apply to the land use commission upon its next
- 13 vacancy.
