A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO OCEAN RESOURCES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the department of
2	land and natural resources (DLNR) has proposed amendments to
3	title 13, chapter 75 of the Hawaii Administrative Rules which
4	regulates lay gill nets. These new rules would limit the size
5	and number of nets, the distance and depths they cover, the
6	amount of time they can be set in the water and left unattended,
7	and the areas where they can be used. Nets would have to be
8	registered with DLNR and carry identification so owners can be
9	held accountable. While these rule changes are meant to protect
10	near-shore waters from over-fishing and the indiscriminate
11	taking of marine life, the legislature finds that:
12	(1) There continues to be a problem with enforcement of
13	current lay gill net rules and this problem will
14	continue to exist with the proposed rules; and
15	(2) The proposed lay gill net rule changes may have an
16	adverse impact on traditional and cultural practices
17	of native Hawaiians.

3	(1) The re	equirement th	nat lay	gill nets	be registere	ed 1

- (1) The requirement that lay gill nets be registered with DLNR. Native Hawaiians have been practicing their culture, including the use of lay gill nets for fishing, for centuries and should not be required to register their nets with a state agency to practice their culture;
 - (2) The requirement that only one net at a time can be used by one person will affect native Hawaiians who often use their lay gill nets as an 'ohana. In these cases, a multitude of family members are used to tend to a net;
 - (3) The prohibition against the use of lay nets in freshwater streams or stream mouths would have a devastating impact on native Hawaiians who have used and continue to use lay nets to catch o'opu in streams;
 - (4) The prohibition on the use of gill nets at night will affect native Hawaiians who continue the cultural practice of fishing by the lunar calendar which includes fishing at night; and

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1	(5) The restriction that lay nets can only be used within			
2	certain waters of the state will impact localized			
3	native Hawaiian communities by completely banning			
4	traditional net making and cultural use of nets from			
5	large geographic locations causing undue hardships on			
6	native Hawaiians.			
7	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to require DLNR to			
8	fully assess the social, cultural, biological, and economic			
9	impacts of proposed lay gill net rules, particularly on native			
10	Hawaiian communities, before adopting and implementing the			
11	rules.			
12	SECTION 2. Chapter 190, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
13	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated			
14	and to read as follows:			
15	"§190- Fishing regulations; lay gill nets;			
16	consultation. Prior to adopting and implementing lay gill net			
17	fishing regulations and prohibitions, the department of land and			
18	natural resources shall consult with native Hawaiian fishing			
19	practitioners and shall not prohibit or limit fishing in any			
20	areas open to public fishing unless:			
21	(1) The department has consulted with native Hawaiian			
22	cultural practitioners and experts in native Hawaiian			



1		fishing practices throughout the administrative rule		
2		making process;		
3	(2)	The proposed prohibitions or restrictions include a		
4		monitoring program and assessment program to determine		
5		the efficacy of the prohibitions or restrictions;		
6	<u>(3)</u>	The proposed prohibitions or restrictions include an		
7		enforcement plan;		
8	(4)	Adequate funding and resources are available to:		
9		(A) Monitor the prohibitions or restrictions;		
10		(B) Enforce the prohibitions or restrictions; and		
11		(C) Assess the efficacy of the prohibitions and		
12		restrictions;		
13		and		
14	<u>(5)</u>	The proposed prohibitions or restrictions are the		
15		result of analysis that includes the use of peer-		
16		reviewed science and Hawaiian science based on		
17		traditional knowledge."		
18	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general			
19	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much			
20	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 for the			
21	development of rules regarding lay net gill fishing.			

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- The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 1
- 2 land and natural resources for the purposes of this Act.
- 3 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 4 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
- 5 provided that section 2 of this Act shall apply to any rules
- 6 adopted or implemented after December 31, 2006.

Description:

Requires DLNR in adopting rules regulating fishing to consult with native Hawaiian practitioners and further imposes conditions on the rule making process regarding prohibitions or limitations or fishing in any area open to public fishing.
