## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO NEUROTRAUMA.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. In 2002, the legislature passed Act 160,
- 2 Session Laws of Hawaii, which recognized the needs of
- 3 individuals who suffer from the physical, cognitive, and
- 4 behavioral consequences of neurotrauma. A special fund was
- 5 established to provide for neurotrauma education, assistance to
- 6 individuals and families to identify and obtain access to
- 7 services, and the creation of a neurotrauma registry within the
- 8 State.
- 9 While there was no provision in the measure to fund direct
- 10 services to neurotrauma survivors, the conference committee
- 11 report noted that the department of health and the neurotrauma
- 12 advisory board would gather data to determine the extent to
- 13 which direct services could reasonably be funded within the
- 14 limits of the resources available in the special fund. The
- 15 conference committee report also noted that this information
- 16 would be presented during the next legislative session so that
- 17 the issue could be revisited.

- The legislature finds that the neurotrauma special fund has 1 collected nearly \$1,500,000 since the fund began in January 2 2003. Based upon that finding as well as the need for services 3 that exists among individuals with neurotrauma, the legislature 4 finds that it is appropriate to permit funds from the 5 neurotrauma special fund to be used to pay for direct services 6 7 to individuals suffering from neurotrauma. The legislature also finds that moneys from the neurotrauma 8 fund should be appropriated to obtain federal and private grant 9 matching funds and create a "traumatic brain injury waiver." 10 The legislature finds that state funds should be used to 11 maximize the receipt of federal funds whenever feasible. 12 13 The purpose of this Act is to allow the neurotrauma special fund to be used to pay for direct services to neurotraumatic 14 survivors and require that money from the special fund be 15 appropriated to obtain federal and private grant matching funds. 16 SECTION 2. Chapter 321H, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 17 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated 18 and to read as follows: 19

4	SECT	ION 3. Section 321H-4, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

8	(1)	Education on neurotrauma;
9	(2)	Assistance to individuals and families to identify and
10		obtain access to services;
11	(3)	Creation of a registry of neurotrauma injuries within
12		the State to identify incidence, prevalence,
13		individual needs, and related information; [and]
14	(4)	Direct services that assist individuals with
15		neurotraumatic injuries; and
16	[-(4)-]	(5) Necessary administrative expenses to carry out
17		this chapter not to exceed two per cent of the total
18		amount collected.

(c) Moneys in the neurotrauma special fund [may] shall be

appropriated to obtain federal and private grant matching funds,

subject to section 321H-4(a)(2)."

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- 1 SECTION 4. The department of human services shall apply
- 2 for any federal waivers necessary for the use of moneys from the
- 3 fund for the purpose of this Act no later than December 31,
- 4 2008.
- 5 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.

## Report Title:

Neurotrauma Special Fund

## Description:
