A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO YOUTH SUICIDE PREVENTION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that more children and 2 young adults die from suicide each year than from cancer, heart 3 disease, AIDS, birth defects, stroke, and chronic lung disease 4 combined. Nationally, over four thousand youths take their 5 lives annually, making suicide the third largest cause of death 6 between the ages of ten and twenty-four.

7 In Hawaii, suicide is the second leading cause of death 8 among fifteen to twenty-four years old. Rates of youth suicide 9 have been on the rise in the last decade among both females and 10 males and among all ethnic groups. In Hawaii, males are more 11 likely than females to commit suicide, and native Hawaiian 12 youths are the most likely ethnic group to attempt or commit 13 suicide.

14 Research demonstrates that youth suicide is linked to
15 underlying mental health problems that can be addressed through
16 early intervention and prevention strategies. The legislature
17 notes that such intervention and prevention strategies have been
18 listed as a national health priority to deal with rising rates
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of youth suicide. Furthermore, Congress passed federal
legislation in 2004, and appropriated \$82,000,000 over the next
three years, for statewide programs designed to help prevent
youth suicide. Many states have already developed comprehensive
statewide youth suicide and early intervention and prevention
strategies that seek to provide effective early intervention and
prevention services.

8 Suicide is a serious public health tragedy affecting children and young adults in Hawaii. The legislature declares 9 10 that preserving and protecting the lives of children and young adults is a priority for the State. The legislature further 11 finds and declares that preventing youth suicide is necessary 12 for the health, safety, and welfare of the residents of the 13 State. Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a 14 15 vouth suicide prevention program for Hawaii.

16 SECTION 2. Chapter 321, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
17 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
18 and to read as follows:

19 "<u>§321-</u> Youth suicide prevention program. (a) The
20 department of health shall establish and operate a statewide
21 youth suicide early intervention and prevention program that



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1	<u>focuses u</u>	pon, but is not necessarily limited to, persons between
2	the ages	of ten and twenty-four, to accomplish the following:
3	(1)	Create public awareness for issues relating to youth
4		suicide prevention;
5	(2)	Build community networks concerning youth suicide
6		prevention; and
7	(3)	Carry out training programs for suicide prevention for
8		law enforcement personnel, providers of health care,
9		school and University of Hawaii employees, and other
10		persons who have contact with individuals at risk of
11		suicide.
12	(b)	The department of health shall provide appropriate
13	research,	training, and technical assistance to carry out the
14	purposes	of this section, which may include, but shall not be
15	limited t	o, the following:
16	(1)	Providing oversight on youth suicide early
17		intervention and prevention strategies;
18	(2)	Identifying and understanding causes and associated
19		risk factors of youth suicide;
20	(3)	Analyzing the efficacy of new and existing youth
21		suicide early intervention techniques and
22		technologies;

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1	(4)	Examining trends in youth suicidal behaviors and
2		nonfatal suicide attempts;
3	(5)	Evaluating and disseminating outcomes and best
4		practices of mental and behavioral health services at
5		institutions of higher education; and
6	(6)	Other activities deemed appropriate by the director of
7		health.
8	<u>(c)</u>	Research, training, and technical assistance resources
9	shall be	provided, but shall not be limited, to the following
10	entities:	
11	(1)	Political subdivisions of the State;
12	(2)	Native Hawaiian health and community organizations;
13	(3)	Institutions of higher education;
14	(4)	The department of education;
15	(5)	Public organizations;
16	(6)	Private nonprofit organizations; and
17	(7)	Health and social service organizations.
18	(d)	The department of health may develop and submit
19	proposals	for funding from federal agencies and private
20	organizat	ions to support the purposes of this section.
21	<u>(e)</u>	The department of health may adopt rules in accordance
22	with chap	ter 91 to implement the purposes of this section."

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
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1	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
2	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so much
3	thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
4	same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
5	2008-2009, for implementation of the statewide youth suicide
6	early intervention and prevention program pursuant to section
7	321- , Hawaii Revised Statutes.
8	The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
9	health for the purposes of this Act.
10	SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
11	SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
12	provided that:
13	(1) Section 3 shall take effect on July 1, 2007; and
14	(2) This Act shall be repealed on June 30, 2009.
