A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DENTISTS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- SECTION 1. Section 448-17, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 2 amended by amending subsection (a) to read as follows: 3 "(a) The board shall refuse to issue a license to any applicant who fails to meet all of the requirements imposed by 4 this chapter and may refuse to issue a license to any applicant 5 who has previously committed any act which would, if committed 6 by a licensee, result in the revocation or suspension of the 7 8 license. In addition to any other actions authorized by law, the 9 board may suspend or revoke any license issued under this 10 chapter and may fine a licensee for any cause authorized by law, 11 12 including but not limited to the following:
- 13 (1) Fraud in procuring license;
- 14 (2) Habitual intoxication or addiction to the use of drugs;
- 16 (3) Wilful or repeated violations of the rules of the department of health;

1	(4)	Acceptance of a fee for service as a witness, without
2		the knowledge of the court, in addition to the fee
3		allowed by the court;
4	(5)	Division of fees or agreeing to split or divide the
5		fees received for dental services with any person for
6		bringing or referring a patient;
7	(6)	Assisting in the care or treatment of a patient,
8		without the knowledge of the patient or the patient's
9		legal representative;
10	(7)	Employing, procuring, inducing, aiding, or abetting a
11		person not licensed or registered as a dentist to
12		engage in the practice of dentistry;
13	(8)	Making any misrepresentations or false promises,
14		directly or indirectly, to influence, persuade, or
15		induce dental patronage;
16	(9)	Professional connection or association with, or
17		lending one's name to another for, the illegal
18		practice of dentistry by another, or professional
19		connection or association with any person, firm, or
20		corporation holding oneself, themselves, or itself out

in any manner contrary to this chapter;

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1	(10)	By false or fraudulent representations, obtaining or
2		seeking to obtain practice or money or any other thing
3		of value;
4	(11)	Practicing, either in the State or elsewhere, under a
5		name other than one's own;
6	(12)	Any other improper, unprofessional, or dishonorable
7		conduct in the practice of dentistry; [and]
8	(13)	Violation of section 447-4[-]; and
9	(14)	False or misleading advertising not otherwise provided
10		for under this subsection, which shall include:
11		(A) Advertising to the public as practicing a dental
12		specialty in which the dentist has not
13		successfully completed the education specified
14		for the dental specialty as defined by the
15		American Dental Association; and
16		(B) Using the following words in advertising
17		"endodontist," "orthodontist," "oral and
18		maxillofacial surgeon, " "specialist, " "board
19		certified, " "diplomat, " "practice limited to, "
20		"pediatric dentist," "periodontist," or "limited
21		to specialty of" when the dentist has not
22		successfully completed the education specified

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1	for the dental specialty as defined by the
2	American Dental Association;
3	provided that this paragraph shall not apply to a
4	dentist who advertises as being qualified in a
5	recognized specialty area of dental practice so long
6	as each advertisement, regardless of form, contains a
7	prominent disclaimer that the dentist is a general
8	dentist or that the specialty services will be
9	provided by a general dentist."
10	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
