## A BILL FOR AN ACT

MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) The legislature finds that a broad 2 definition of "experiential learning" is "knowledge, skills, and/or abilities attained through observation, simulation, 3 and/or participation that provides depth and meaning to learning 4 5 by engaging the mind and/or body through activity, reflection, 6 and application." Experiential learning can take place in many 7 different settings and have many objectives. Businesses and organizations provide the learning opportunities-generally a 8 9 for-profit or not-for-profit business, but government agencies 10 and other organizations may be included. The scope of services and information that may be provided 11 12 include: Career shadowing (students spend time with and observe 13 (1) 14 employees in different occupations); Tours and field trips, and guest speakers; 15 (2) Audio/visual and resource materials; 16 (3)

Workplace mentors and advisors for career clubs;

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- 1 (5) Technical assistance; 2 Work-study programs, internships, and scholarships; (6) Jobs and volunteer work; and 3 (7)4 (8) Participation in career awareness events, such as fairs, business seminars and conferences, and working 5 with special education students. 6 The legislature further finds that availability of 7 experiential learning opportunities for Hawaii's K-12 and post-8 9 secondary learners will enhance their education and career 10 choices. To that end, development of a database of experiential 11 learning opportunities would assist educators in finding appropriate opportunities for learners, and the number of 12 entities volunteering would increase if the mechanics of 13 14 volunteering were simplified by linking the database proposed in this Act to existing sites. For instance, the proposed database 15 could link to the Hawaii Science and Technology Council's 16 17 website that includes a listing of opportunities and members who 18 are willing to provide experiential learning to students. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to the 19 (b)

| 5  | SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general              |
| 6  | revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$75,000, or so much  |
| 7  | thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, to the    |
| 8  | University of Hawaii for research and development of a statewide |
| 9  | web-based database of experiential learning opportunities in two |
| 10 | phases:  |
| 11 | (1) Design, for a maximum of fifteen per cent of the total       |
| 12 | amount provided; and   |
| 13 | (2) Development and implementation, including provisions         |
| 14 | for future reasonable modifications and additions.               |
| 15 | The design phase shall incorporate input from the                |
| 16 | university system, the department of education, the department   |
| 17 | of labor and industrial relations, the workforce development     |
| 18 | council, the Chamber of Commerce of Hawaii, and other employers  |
| 19 | and employer associations and interested parties.                |
| 20 | The development and implementation phase shall include           |
| 21 | links to other databases, both public and private, with similar  |
| 22 | data that may be shared.   |

The study shall be undertaken in consultation with the 3 4 department of education, the Hawaii P-20 initiative, and the workforce development council. 5 SECTION 4. The sums appropriated in sections 2 and 3 shall 6 be expended by the University of Hawaii for the purposes of this 7 8 Act. 9 SECTION 5. The University of Hawaii shall submit two 10 separate reports: One report on its efforts to effectuate the program 11 (1) required under section 2, including recommendations 12 13 for further action; and (2) One report on its efforts to effectuate the program 14 required under section 3, including recommendations 15 for further actions, 16 17 to the legislature no later than twenty days before the 18 convening of the regular session of 2008.

SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
