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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LABOR AND INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State's
2	employment and training fund, established under section 383-128,
3	Hawaii Revised Statutes, has a declining balance since the
4	enactment of Act 248, Session Laws of Hawaii 2002, which reduced
5	employer assessments to the fund. The reduction in the fund's
6	revenues has resulted in the unintended consequence of a
7	deficiency in the administration of the fund.
8	The purpose of this Act is to:
9	(1) Establish an advisory committee to make
10	recommendations, relative to the employment and
11	training fund, to the legislature on:
12	(A) Methods to increase revenues to the fund; and
13	(B) Improvements to administration of the fund; and
14	(2) Transfer reverted revenues to the employment and
15	training fund; and
16	(3) Make an appropriation to the employment and training
17	fund to increase training.

1 SECTION 2. Chapter 36, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated and to 2 3 read as follows: 4 "§36- Transfer of reverted revenues to employment and 5 training fund. The director of finance, with the approval of 6 the governor, may transfer at the end of every fiscal year, up 7 to ten per cent of unexpended and unencumbered funds in special 8 funds, revolving funds, special accounts, or appropriations, 9 that are unexpended and unencumbered at the end of a fiscal year 10 and that would otherwise revert into the general fund, to the 11 credit of the employment and training fund under section 12 383-128. The amounts transferred to the employment and training 13 fund shall be deemed to be appropriated to that fund for the 14 purpose of article VII, section 4, of the state constitution." 15 SECTION 3. (a) There is established a temporary advisory 16 committee to make recommendations to the legislature and the 17 department of labor and industrial relations on the

 19 report on the progress of implementing the temporary advisory
 20 committee's recommendations, which shall be included in the
 21 department's report to the legislature on the status of the

1 employment and training fund pursuant to section 383-128(h), 2 Hawaii Revised Statutes. (f) The temporary advisory committee shall cease to exist 3 4 on May 15, 2008. 5 SECTION 4. There is appropriated out of the general 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, to 7 8 be deposited into the employment and training fund, established in section 383-128, Hawaii Revised Statutes. 9 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the employment and 10 11 training fund the sum of \$, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the same sum, or so 12 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009, for 13 purposes set forth in section 383-128(b), Hawaii Revised 14 15 Statutes. 16 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department

of labor and industrial relations for the purposes of this Act.

SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
