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A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PROHIBITION OF FUNDRAISERS OR FUNDRAISING ACTIVITY WHILE THE LEGISLATURE IS IN SESSION.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the public
- 2 perception that lawmaking is influenced by a legislator's
- 3 campaign fundraising should be addressed and eliminated. During
- 4 the legislative session, many individuals, businesses, and other
- 5 groups seek favorable action from legislators on measures
- 6 introduced and heard throughout the session. When legislators
- 7 solicit campaign donations from similar stakeholders while
- 8 legislation is pending, the public has reason to mistrust the
- 9 lawmaking process. As a result, the public becomes leery that
- 10 legislative votes are affected by fundraising activity. Even
- 11 with pure motives, public perception of the legislature is
- 12 lowered, along with public trust and confidence in elected
- 13 leaders.
- In the past, bills to scrutinize legislative fundraisers
- 15 during the session have been introduced. For example, in 2003,
- 16 a bill requiring public disclosure of fundraising events while

- 1 the legislature is in session passed the senate, but failed in
- 2 the house of representatives.
- 3 The legislature believes that banning fundraisers during
- 4 regular sessions of the legislature will reduce public suspicion
- 5 and result in increased public trust and confidence in our
- 6 elected leaders.
- 7 The purpose of this Act is to prohibit fundraising activity
- 8 during regular sessions of the legislature.
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 11-203, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 "§11-203 Fundraisers and fundraising activities. (a) As
- 12 used in this section, "fundraiser" means any function held for
- 13 the benefit of a person that is intended or designed, directly
- 14 or indirectly, to raise funds for political purposes for which
- 15 the price or suggested contribution for attending the function
- 16 is more than \$25 per person.
- 17 (b) There shall be no more than two fundraisers held for a
- 18 person prior to a general or special election in which that
- 19 person is either elected or defeated.
- 20 (c) No fundraiser or fundraising activity shall be held
- 21 unless a notice of intent to hold the function is filed by the
- 22 person in charge of the function with the commission prior to



- 1 the date of the function setting forth the name and address of
- 2 the person in charge, the price per person, the date, hour, and
- 3 place of the affair and the method thereof.
- 4 (d) Fundraisers sponsored by a candidate for a statewide
- 5 office are exempt from the \$25 limit of subsection (a) and the
- 6 restrictions of subsection (b), and fundraisers sponsored by a
- 7 party for a political purpose for the general benefit of the
- 8 party are exempt from the restrictions of subsection (b).
- 9 (e) No fundraiser or fundraising activity shall be held by
- 10 any state legislator during the period in which the legislature
- 11 is in regular session."
- 12 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
