A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that there is a need to
- 2 improve the State's economic foundation and increase opportunity
- 3 for all Hawaii residents.
- 4 Currently, farmers are hindered from selling food because
- 5 of their inability to consolidate, process, and ship marketable
- 6 quantities of food. The development of a pilot program is
- 7 necessary to start a coordinated statewide network for
- 8 agricultural processing, consolidation, marketing, and shipping
- 9 facilities. Facilities for this purpose are referred to as
- 10 "terminal markets."
- 11 Terminal markets enable farmers with small and large farms
- 12 to sell crops to meet military and non-military food
- 13 requirements through better processing, consolidation of small
- 14 farm offerings, dependable delivery, and quality assurance.
- 15 Since the nation is in a state of war, it is essential that
- 16 every possible action is taken to increase the availability of
- 17 fresh foods for the public, the military, and for export to the
- 18 mainland.

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1 The purpose of this Act is to support a coordinated, statewide network of agricultural processing, marketing, and 2 shipping facilities by establishing a terminal market pilot 3 program on the island of Hawaii. This Act appropriates: 4 5 (1)\$200,000 for planning a pilot program on the island of Hawaii; 6 \$50,000 to hire a consultant to assist in planning 7 (2) terminal markets; and 8 9 (3) \$3,000,000 in general obligation bonds for construction and equipment costs for a terminal market 10 and vacuum cooling plant for the island of Hawaii. 11 In addition, this Act requires the consultant to work with 12 13 the department of agriculture to form a committee, reflecting the interests affected by this Act, to recommend policies, 14 rules, and procedures to be followed by any operator chosen by 15 the department of agriculture to operate terminal markets under 16 17 this Act. SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general 18 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$200,000, or so much 19 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, for the 20 purpose of planning a pilot program on the island of Hawaii to 21

demonstrate the first of several linked terminal markets to

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- 1 serve food producers, distributors, retailers, military buyers,
- 2 private distributors, and retail outlets.
- 3 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of
- 4 agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 5 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
- 6 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$50,000, or so much
- 7 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, for the
- 8 department of agriculture to hire a consultant who shall be
- 9 exempt from chapters 76, 78, and 89, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 10 to:
- (1) Plan terminal markets on the islands of Maui and
- 12 Hawaii to accept orders, process products for
- shipment, and to ship fresh foods to wholesale buyers
- 14 using transportation available at the ports of Hilo
- 15 and Kahului;
- 16 (2) Plan for the operation and coordination of terminal
- 17 market facilities on Kauai and Oahu to be capable of
- filling military and private orders;
- 19 (3) Prepare to build facilities and provide necessary
- 20 equipment to achieve marketing goals; and
- 21 (4) Coordinate with the department of agriculture to form
- a committee as specified under section 4 of this Act.

1	The	sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of	
2	agriculture for the purposes of this Act.		
3	SECT	ION 4. (a) The consultant hired under section 3 of	
4	this Act	shall be a person with experience working with	
5	agricultural production and marketing and with knowledge of		
6	military food purchasing procedures. The consultant shall		
7	coordinate with the department of agriculture to form a		
8	committee that reflects the interests affected by this Act. The		
9	members o	f the committee shall include:	
10	(1)	One representative each from the farm bureau serving	
11		Maui, the island of Hawaii, and Oahu;	
12	(2)	One representative of the mayor of Maui;	
13	(3)	One representative of the mayor of the island of	
14		Hawaii;	
15	(4)	One representative from the University of Hawaii	
16		college of tropical agriculture and human resources at	
17		Hilo;	
18	(5)	One representative from the agriculture research	
19		station at Mealani;	
20	(6)	One person with a minimum of five years experience	

with growing and selling fresh produce to hotels,

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1		retail market changes, and the federal defense
2		logistics agency; and
3	(7)	One representative from the Hawaii Agriculture
4		Research Center.
5	(b)	The committee shall elect a chairperson from among its
6	members.	The committee shall recommend policies, rules, and
7	procedure	s to be followed by any operator chosen by the
8	departmen	t of agriculture in operating terminal markets under
9	this Act.	The chairperson may request from the department of
10	agriculture reimbursements for:	
11	(1)	Travel expenses for members;
12	(2)	Costs of providing notification to the public; and
13	(3)	Costs associated with reports of public meetings
14		regarding the purposes of this Act and issuance of a
15		summary report on committee recommendations, if
16		desired by the committee.
17	SECT	ION 5. The director of finance is authorized to issue
18	general o	bligation bonds in the sum of \$3,000,000, or so much
19	thereof a	s may be necessary and the same sum or so much thereof
20	as may be	necessary is appropriated for fiscal year 2007-2008,
21	for const	ruction and equipment for a terminal market and vacuum

cooling plant for the island of Hawaii, including provision of

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- 1 communications capability necessary to coordinate orders from
- 2 buyers worldwide between facilities on the islands of Maui,
- 3 Hawaii, and Oahu.
- 4 The sum appropriated in this section shall be expended by
- 5 the department of agriculture for the purposes of this Act.
- 6 SECTION 6. The appropriation made for the capital
- 7 improvement project authorized in section 5 of this Act shall
- 8 not lapse at the end of the fiscal year for which the
- 9 appropriation is made; provided that all moneys from the
- 10 appropriation unencumbered as of June 30, 2010, shall lapse as
- 11 of that date.
- 12 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.

Description:

Appropriates \$200,000 to plan a terminal market pilot program on the Big Island; appropriates \$50,000 for the Department of Agriculture (DOA) to hire a consultant to assist in planning terminal markets; authorizes \$3,000,000 in general obligation bonds to finance construction and equipment for a terminal market and vacuum cooling plant on the island of Hawaii; requires the consultant to work with DOA to form a Committee relating to terminal markets.
