A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BUILDING CODES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to promote the health, safety, and welfare of the occupants or users of buildings and structures and the general public through the 3 adoption of a uniform statewide model building code. 4 SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by 5 adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read 6 7 as follows: 8 "CHAPTER STATE BUILDING CODE 9 10 -1 Definitions. As used in this chapter, unless the 11 context otherwise requires: "Commission" means the state building code commission. 12 "State building code" means the uniform statewide model 13 14 building code.
- 15 § -2 State building code commission. (a) There is
 16 hereby established a state building code commission. The

1	commissio	n shall be attached to the department of accounting and
2	general s	ervices for administrative purposes only.
3	(d)	The commission shall consist of nine voting members,
4	who, exce	pt as provided in paragraph (1), shall be appointed by
5	the gover	nor, and one nonvoting member. The members shall
6	include:	
7	(1)	One county building official from each of the counties
8		of Kauai, Maui, and Hawaii and the city and county of
9		Honolulu, appointed by the mayor of each county;
10	(2)	One member representing the state fire council;
11	(3)	One member representing the state department of health
12		with significant experience in building mechanical and
13		sewage disposal systems;
14	(4)	One member representing the department of labor and
15		industrial relations with significant experience in
16		fire safety;
17	(5)	One member representing the Structural Engineers
18		Association of Hawaii;
19	(6)	One member representing the American Institute of
20		Architects, Hawaii State Chapter; and
21	(7)	The comptroller or the comptroller's designated
22		representative who shall be the nonvoting member.



- (c) Members shall not be compensated, but shall be 1 reimbursed for interisland travel and other expenses directly 2 3 related to performance of their duties. The chairperson of the commission shall be elected 4 annually by a majority of all of the commission members. 5 6 (e) Except as provided in this section, the commission shall be subject to sections 26-34, 26-35, 26-35.5, and 26-36. 7 8 -3 Executive director and executive assistant; 9 employees. (a) The commission shall select an executive 10 director, who shall serve at the pleasure of the commission and 11 who shall have administrative abilities and expertise in 12 engineering or architecture, and an executive assistant, who 13 shall have experience in statutory and administrative rulemaking 14 processes. The positions of executive director and executive 15 assistant shall not be subject to chapter 76; provided that the executive director and executive assistant shall be entitled to 16 17 any rights and benefits accorded to similarly employed state 18 employees. The salaries of the executive director and executive 19 assistant shall be determined by the commission.
- 20 (b) The commission may engage employees necessary to 21 perform its duties, including administrative personnel, as 22 provided by section 26-35.

4	uniform s	tate building code through the rulemaking process set

6	(b)	If the commission does not adopt the state building
7	code by D	ecember 31, 2008, then the latest editions of the codes
8	set forth	in subsection (c)(1) to (2), together, shall
9	constitut	e the state building code.
10	(c)	The state building code shall be based upon:
11	(1)	The latest editions, as published by the International
12		Code Council, of:
13		(A) The International Building Code;
14		(B) The International Residential Code;
15		(C) The International Mechanical Code;
16	(2)	The latest edition of the Uniform Plumbing Code, as
17		copyrighted and published by the International
18		Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials,
19		20001 Walnut Drive South, Walnut, California 91789-
20		2825, including its appendices; and
21	(3)	Code provisions based upon nationally published codes
22		or standards that include but are not limited to fire,



1	elevator, electrical energy conservation standards fo
2	building design and construction, private sewage
3	disposal, and hurricane resistive standards for one-
4	and two-family residential construction.
5	(d) In adopting the state building code, the commission
6	shall appoint a subcommittee comprised solely of each of the
7	commissioners appointed pursuant to section -2(b)(1), whose
8	duty shall be to recommend to the commission any necessary or
9	desirable state amendments to the codes and standards in
10	subsection (c), for inclusion in the state building code. Any
11	recommended state amendments shall require the unanimous
12	agreement of the subcommittee.
13	(e) The commission may appoint other committees to handle
14	investigative functions or provide technical expertise that may
15	include commissioners and other appropriate persons.
16	(f) In adopting the state building code, the commission
17	shall not adopt provisions that:
18	(1) Relate to administrative, permitting, or enforcement
19	and inspection procedures of each county; or
20	(2) Prohibit indigenous, pre-western contact, Hawaiian
21	architecture.

- 7 or grants at the state and county levels relating to the
 8 implementation and enforcement of the state building code and
 9 county building codes adopted pursuant to this chapter.
- 10 (i) The commission may make expenditures for technical
 11 references, equipment and supplies, and other operating expenses
 12 and may contract, pursuant to chapter 103D, for the conduct of
 13 research studies and provision of technical services.
- 14 -5 County building codes; exemptions. (a) Any law, 15 charter provision, ordinance, or rule notwithstanding, upon the 16 adoption of the state building code by the commission or the 17 automatic enactment of the state building code pursuant to 18 section -4 (b), the state building code shall be the building 19 code for each county and shall supersede any law, charter 20 provision, ordinance, or rule of any county relating to building 21 codes and standards.

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         (b) At any time prior to the adoption of the state
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    building code and from time to time after the adoption of the
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    state building code by the commission, any county may petition
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    the commission for an exemption from the state building code as
    it applies within the petitioning county's jurisdiction.
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    county exemption shall be consistent with the minimum
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    performance standards of the state building code, promote the
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    health, safety, and welfare of the occupants or users of
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    buildings and structures and the general public, and shall be
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    subject to the approval of a majority of the members of the
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    commission."
         SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
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    revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of $
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    thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and the
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    same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year
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    2008-2009, for the operations of the state building code
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    commission and any technical assistance services and technical
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    assistance grants provided by the commission to the city and
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    county of Honolulu, the county of Hawaii, the county of Kauai,
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    and the county of Maui.
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         The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
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    of accounting and general services for the purposes of this Act.
