A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMERGENCY RELIEF FOR NATURAL DISASTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Residents and businesses of the State are often
- 2 twice victimized when natural disasters strike. First, the
- 3 damage caused by a natural disaster is often extensive and
- 4 repair or replacement costs are prohibitive. Second, the
- 5 emergency relief from governmental agencies to meet the
- 6 immediate needs of victims is often delayed or unavailable for
- 7 extended periods. For some victims of natural disasters, the
- 8 delay in receiving emergency assistance can mean a total loss of
- 9 their homes or businesses. The legislature finds that there is
- 10 an urgent need to provide victims with prompt emergency relief
- 11 during or immediately after a natural disaster.
- 12 The purpose of this Act is to allow the governor, upon the
- 13 declaration of an emergency, to release up to ten per cent of
- 14 the moneys appropriated from the emergency and budget reserve
- 15 fund to provide assistance to residents and businesses that have
- 16 sustained damage during or immediately after a natural disaster.

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         SECTION 2. Chapter 128, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
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    and to read as follows:
         "§128- Emergency and budget reserve fund expenditures.
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    Upon the declaration by the governor of an emergency due to a

    natural disaster, the governor, by executive order, may
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    authorize the release and expenditure of moneys appropriated
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    from the emergency and budget reserve fund to provide emergency
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    assistance to residents or businesses of the State for damages
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    sustained from a natural disaster, during or immediately after
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    the natural disaster, pursuant to section 328L-3(e)."
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         SECTION 3. Section 328L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
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    amended to read as follows:
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         "§328L-3 Emergency and budget reserve fund. (a) There is

    established in the state treasury the emergency and budget

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1	(b) All interest earned from moneys in the emergency and				
2	budget reserve fund shall be credited to the general fund.				
3	(c) Expenditures from the emergency and budget reserve				
4	fund shall be a temporary supplemental source of funding for the				
5	State during times of emergency, economic downturn, or				
6	unforeseen reduction in revenues. No expenditures shall be made				
7	from the emergency and budget reserve fund except pursuant to				
8	appropriations[+] or as provided in subsection (e). The general				
9	appropriations bill or the supplemental appropriations bill, as				
10	defined in section 9 of article VII of the Constitution of the				
11	State of Hawaii, shall not be used to appropriate moneys from				
12	the emergency and budget reserve fund. The governor, through an				
13	appropriations bill, may recommend expenditures from the				
14	emergency and budget reserve fund by setting forth the purposes				
15	of the expenditures consistent with subsection (d), the amounts,				
16	and the reasons justifying the necessity for the appropriations.				
17	(d) The legislature may make appropriations from the fund				
18	for the following purposes:				
19	(1) To maintain levels of programs determined to be				
20	essential to public health, safety, welfare, and				
21	education;				

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1	(2) To provide for counter cyclical economic and				
2	employment programs in periods of economic downturn;				
3	(3) To restore facilities destroyed or damaged or services				
4	disrupted by disaster in any county; and				
5	(4) To meet other emergencies when declared by the				
6	governor or determined to be urgent by the				
7	legislature.				
8	Any act making appropriations from the emergency and budget				
9	reserve fund shall include a declaration of findings and				
10	purposes setting forth the purposes, the amounts, and the				
11	reasons why the appropriations are necessary and shall require a				
12	two-thirds majority vote of each house of the legislature.				
13	(e) Upon the declaration by the governor of an emergency				
14	due to a natural disaster, the governor, by executive order, may				
15	authorize the release and expenditure of moneys from the fund to				
16	provide emergency assistance to residents or businesses of the				
17	State for damages sustained from a natural disaster, during or				
18	immediately after the natural disaster, subject to the following				
19	requirements:				
20	(1) The governor shall determine the amount of moneys to				
21	be released based upon the recommendations of state				
22	and county civil defense agencies; provided that the				



1		amount expended shall not exceed ten per cent of the			
2		interest earned on principal from moneys in the fund			
3		at the time of the expenditure;			
4	(2)	Within seventy-two hours after issuing the executive			
5		order, the governor shall provide written notice to			
6		the president of the senate and the speaker of the			
7		house of representatives describing the intended use			
8		of the moneys; and			
9	(3)	The governor shall submit a report to the legislature			
10		not later than twenty days prior to the convening of			
11		the regular session or any special session immediately			
12		following the occurrence of the natural disaster,			
13		regarding the release and expenditure of moneys from			
14		the fund under this subsection; provided that if the			
15		natural disaster occurs in the period between thirty			
16		days prior to the convening of a regular session or			
17		the closing of the regular session, the governor shall			
18		submit the report not later than thirty days after			
19		issuing the executive order. At a minimum the report			
20		shall:			
21		(A) State the amounts released;

2			which the funds were released;
3		<u>(C)</u>	Explain the factors that necessitated the use of
4			moneys in the fund; and
5		<u>(D)</u>	Provide recommendations for replacing the
6			expended moneys from the fund.

Description:
