A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO RECYCLING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 342G, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
2	amended by adding a new section to part IV to be appropriately			
3	designated and to read as follows:			
4	"§342G- Recycling and waste reduction plans and			
5	implementation for government offices and buildings. (a) The			
6	office shall ensure that all state and county government			
7	agencies create and implement mandatory recycling and waste			
8	reduction plans for all government buildings and offices. State			
9	plans, provided by each state department, including the			
10	University of Hawaii, shall be completed by June 30, 2008 and			
11	implemented by December 1, 2008. County plans, provided by each			
12	department in each county, shall be completed by December 31,			
13	2008 and implemented by July 1, 2009.			
14	(b) The state and county plans shall include the			
15	following:			
16	(1) A listing of mandatory recyclable materials that shall			

include: cardboard, plastics, glass, green waste,

1		metal, newspaper, office paper, storage	batteries, and
2		waste oil;	
3	(2) Established waste diversion goals of fifteen per cen		
4		within one year and twenty-five per cen	t within two
5		years of implementation;	
6	(3)	Department reporting systems that docum	ent the
7		department's efforts in meeting its goa	ls; and
8	(4)	Recognizing market conditions, efforts	to establish
9		relationships with the recycling indust	ry and private
10		sector to maximize recycling efforts an	d open new
11		markets."	
12	SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general		
13	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so
14	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and		
15	the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal		
16	year 2008-2009, to assist the counties in implementing section 1		
17	of this A	ct. The specific county appropriations	are as follows:

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- 1 The sums appropriated to each county shall be expended by
- 2 the respective county for the purposes of this Act.
