A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CORRECTIONS OFFICERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 88-281, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "\$88-281 Service retirement. (a) A member who has ten
- 4 years of credited service and has attained age sixty-two, or a
- 5 member with thirty years credited service who has attained the
- 6 age of fifty-five, shall become eligible to receive a retirement
- 7 allowance after the member has terminated service.
- 8 (b) If a member has at least twenty-five years of credited
- 9 service as a sewer worker or as a water safety officer of which
- 10 the last five or more years prior to retirement is credited in
- 11 such a capacity, then the sewer worker or water safety officer
- 12 shall be eligible to receive a retirement benefit unreduced for
- 13 age after the member has terminated service.
- 14 (c) A member who has twenty years of credited service and
- 15 has attained age fifty-five shall be eligible to receive an
- 16 early retirement allowance reduced for age after the member has
- 17 terminated service.

- 1 (d) A member who has ten years of credited service and terminates service prior to attaining age sixty-two shall have a 2 vested right and shall be eliqible to receive a retirement 3 allowance when the member has attained age sixty-five. 4 5 (e) If a member has at least thirty years of credited service through June 30, 2003; twenty-nine years of credited 6 7 service on or after July 1, 2004; twenty-eight years of credited 8 service on or after July 1, 2005; twenty-seven years of credited service on or after July 1, 2006; twenty-six years of credited 9 service on or after July 1, 2007; and twenty-five years of 10 11 credited service on or after July 1, 2008, as an emergency medical technician, of which the last five or more years prior 12 to retirement is credited service in that capacity, the 13 emergency medical technician shall be eligible to receive a 14 15 retirement benefit unreduced for age after the member has 16 terminated service. (f) If a member has at least twenty-five years of credited 17 service on or after July 1, 2007, as a corrections officer, of 18 which the last five or more years prior to retirement is 19 20 credited service in that capacity, the corrections officer shall be eligible to receive a retirement benefit unreduced for age 21

after the member has terminated service.

2	to the board, specifying the desired date of retirement, which		
3	shall be not less than thirty days nor more than one hundred		
4	fifty days subsequent to the date of filing. Retirement shall		
5	be effective on the first day of a month, except for the month		
6	of December when retirement on the first or last day of the		
7	month shall be allowed."		
8	SECTION 2. Section 88-282, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
9	amended to read as follows:		
10	"§88-282 Service retirement allowance. Upon retirement		
11	from service, a member shall receive a retirement allowance as		
12	follows:		
13	(1) If the member has met the requirements in		
14	section 88-281(a), (b), (d), $[\frac{\text{or}}{\text{or}}]$ (e), or f, a maximum		
15	retirement allowance of one and one-fourth per cent of		
16	the average final compensation multiplied by the		
17	number of years of credited service; or		
18	(2) If the member has met the requirements in		
19	section 88-281(c), an early retirement allowance equal		
20	to the maximum retirement allowance reduced by		
21	one-half per cent for each month the member is less		
22	than age sixty-two at retirement."		

- 1 SECTION 3. Section 88-331, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[f] §88-331[f] Service retirement. (a) A class H member
- 4 who has five years of credited service and has attained age
- 5 sixty-two, or a class H member with thirty years credited
- 6 service who has attained the age of fifty-five shall become
- 7 eligible to receive a retirement allowance after the member has
- 8 terminated service.
- 9 (b) A class H member who has at least twenty-five years of
- 10 credited service as a sewer worker or water safety officer, of
- 11 which the last five or more years prior to retirement is
- 12 credited service in that capacity, shall become eligible to
- 13 receive a retirement allowance unreduced for age after the
- 14 member has terminated service.
- 15 (c) A class H member who has twenty years of credited
- 16 service and has attained age fifty-five shall be eligible to
- 17 receive an early retirement allowance reduced for age after the
- 18 member has terminated service.
- (d) If a class H member has at least twenty-eight years of
- 20 credited service on or after July 1, 2005; twenty-seven years of
- 21 credited service on or after July 1, 2006; twenty-six years of
- 22 credited service on or after July 1, 2007; and twenty-five years



- 1 of credited service on or after July 1, 2008, as an emergency
- 2 medical technician, of which the last five or more years prior
- 3 to retirement is credited service in that capacity, the member
- 4 shall be eligible to receive a retirement benefit unreduced for
- 5 age after the member has terminated service.
- 6 (e) If a class H member has at least twenty-five years of

- 8 officer, of which the last five or more years prior to
- 9 retirement is credited service in that capacity, the corrections
- 10 officer shall be eligible to receive a retirement benefit
- 11 unreduced for age after the member has terminated service.
- 12 [(e)] (f) A class H member may retire upon the written
- 13 application to the system, specifying the desired date of
- 14 retirement, which shall be not less than thirty days nor more
- 15 than one hundred fifty days subsequent to the date of filing.
- 16 Retirement shall be effective on the first day of a month,
- 17 except for the month of December when retirement on the first or
- 18 last day of the month shall be allowed."
- 19 SECTION 4. Section 88-332, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 20 amended to read as follows:

1	"§88-332 Service retirement allowance. Upon retireme	nt
2	from service, a class H member shall receive a maximum	
3	retirement allowance as follows:	
4	(1) If the member has met the requirements in section	
5	88-331(a), (b), $[extit{or}]$ (d), $extit{or}$ (e), a maximum retir	ement
6	allowance of two per cent of the average final	
7	compensation multiplied by the number of years of	
8	class H credited service, plus a retirement allow	ance
9	at the rate of one and one-fourth per cent of the	
10	member's average final compensation multiplied by	the
11	number of years of class C credited service; or	
12	(2) If the member has met the requirements in	
13	section 88-331(c), an early retirement allowance	equal
14	to the maximum retirement allowance calculated as	
15	provided in paragraph (1), reduced by 0.4166 per	cent
16	for each month the member is less than age sixty-	two
