5 ""Drug offender" means a person who has been convicted at



- 7 "Drug offense" means an offense that is:
- 8 (1) Set forth in section 712-1240.5, 712-1240.7, 712-
- 9 1240.8, or 712-1241;
- 10 (2) Any federal, military, or out-of-state conviction for
- 11 any offense that under the laws of this State would be
- a drug offense as defined in paragraph (1); or
- 13 (3) An act, as described in chapter 705, that is an
- 14 attempt, criminal solicitation, or criminal conspiracy
- 15 to commit one of the offenses designated in paragraphs
- 16 (1) and (2)."
- 17 2. By amending the definitions of "covered offender" and18 "covered offense" to read as follows:




