## **EPA Action Items**

- Distribute presentations from workshop. (completed 7/20)
- Distribute action items and attendee list. (completed 8/1)
- Draft and distribute a data collection form for stakeholder input. (by 3<sup>rd</sup> week of August)
- Review information provided by Nathalie Peloquin, Natural Resources Canada, from Statistics Canada on viewing choices, hours spent, gaming, etc to determine whether this would be useful in determining appropriate duty cycles and weightings for APLs. (early August)
- Engage CEE's home electronics group to determine if they have any product usage data that may be helpful in determining appropriate duty cycles and weightings for APLs. (early August)
- Develop detailed Standby Mode testing instructions and distribute for stakeholder input. (mid September)

## Stakeholder Action Items

- Bill Schindler, Panasonic, to share information on gaming industry experts with EPA.
- CEA to conduct consumer survey to determine numbers of hours/day TVs are on in the U.S.; results will be shared with EPA, once survey is completed, to inform duty cycles and weightings for APLs. (September)
- Interested stakeholders to join the IEC TV Working Group and contribute directly to the development of an on mode test procedure for TVs.
- Ecos Consulting to share metering results from CA homes, once available, to inform duty cycles for TVs. (September)
