## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII PAROLING AUTHORITY.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the Hawaii paroling 2 authority plays a vital role in our criminal justice system. 3 determines minimum terms of incarceration for almost all inmates sentenced to prison; grants parole when it determines that an 4 inmate is ready for release into the community; establishes 5 6 terms and conditions of parole for each offender granted parole; 7 oversees parole officers who monitor and supervise parolees; 8 grants discharges from parole; and makes recommendations for 9 pardons and commutations of sentences. 10 The authority was created in 1976 with one full-time member 11 and two part-time members. In the past thirty-six years, its 12 workload has increased eight-fold due to the rise in 13 incarceration rates. However, the authority continues to be 14 comprised of one full-time and two part-time members. 15 it is essentially a part-time body, the authority finds proper deliberation very difficult when reviewing cases and making 16 decisions that are vital to public safety. Further, the 17 18 authority is experiencing severe difficulties in carrying out



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its responsibility in assuring that the terms and conditions of

    parole are properly enforced with a less than full-time

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         The purpose of this Act is to change the two part-time
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    members of the Hawaii paroling authority to full-time members.
         SECTION 2. Section 353-63, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is

    amended to read as follows:
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         "§353-63 Service of Hawaii paroling authority members;
    compensation[ + expenses]. The chairperson and the other two
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    members of the Hawaii paroling authority shall serve on a full-

    time basis. [The other two members shall serve on a part-time
    basis.] Effective July 1, 2005, the chairperson of the Hawaii
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    paroling authority shall be paid a salary set at eighty-seven
    per cent of the salary of the director of public safety. [The]
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    Effective July 1, 2007, the compensation of each of the [part-
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    time] other two members of the Hawaii paroling authority shall
    be set at eighty per cent of the [hourly wage paid] salary of
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    the chairperson. [For each hour engaged in the official duties
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    of the authority, each part-time member of the authority shall
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    be paid an hourly wage at the percentage rate specified in this
    section based on the hourly wage paid the chairperson; provided
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    that compensation shall not exceed eighty per cent of the total
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    regular working hours in a month, provided further that part-
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    time members shall not be entitled to any vacation, sick leave,
    or other benefits except as provided in this section. All
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    paroling authority members shall receive their necessary
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    expenses for travel and incidentals which shall be paid from
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    appropriations provided the authority for such purposes, on
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    vouchers approved by the director of public safety.] "
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         SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general
    revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of $ or so much
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    thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008 and
            or so much as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009
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    to carry out the purpose of this Act, including the purchase of
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    office equipment and other expenses related to the new full-time
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    paroling authority members.
         The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
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    of public safety for the purposes of this Act.
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         SECTION 4. Any persons who were appointed as part-time
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    members of the Hawaii paroling authority by the governor in
    accordance with sections 26-34 and 353-61, Hawaii Revised
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    Statutes, and who serve as part-time members on the day
    immediately preceding the effective date of this Act shall
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    become full-time members of the Hawaii paroling authority on the
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- 1 effective date of this Act and continue serving their current
- 2 terms of appointment.
- 3 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 4 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 5 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
