### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

## H.B. NO. (a) Recklessly allows another person to inflict serious or substantial bodily injury on the minor; or (b) Recklessly causes or permits the minor to inject, ingest [methamphetamine.], or inhale a controlled substance that has not been prescribed by a physician for the minor."
