## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE PHARMACY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 346-341, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by repealing the definitions of "asset test", "full 2 3 coverage prescription drug benefit", and "liquid assets". [""Asset test" means the asset limits for eligibility in 4 5 the state pharmacy assistance program as defined by the Medicare Modernization Act and any amendments thereto."] 6 7 [""Full coverage prescription drug benefit" means a federally approved prescription drug plan that offers a zero co-8 9 payment benefit for medicaid dual eligibles under the medicare 10 part D drug benefit."] 11 [""Liquid assets" means assets used in the eligibility 12 determination process as defined by the Medicare Modernization 13 Act."] SECTION 2. Section 346-342, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 15 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 16 "(b) The department [may] shall provide enrollment 17 assistance to eligible individuals [into the state pharmacy

1	assistance program. Enrollment for medicaid dual eligible
2	persons shall begin no later than October 1, 2005.] by:
3	(1) Identifying the medicare prescription drug plans that
4	best meet the needs of the enrollee at the lowest
5	cost, based on the enrollee's medication, pharmacy,
6	and overall costs; and
7	(2) Assisting the enrollee in joining or changing plans.
8	SECTION 3. Section 346-343, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
9	amended to read as follows:
10	"§346-343 Eligibility. (a) All residents of the state
11	shall be eligible to participate in the state pharmacy
12	assistance program; provided that the applicant:
13	(1) Is a resident of Hawaii;
14	(2) Is sixty-five years or older, or is disabled and
15	receiving a social security benefit;
16	(3) Has a household income at or below [one] two hundred
17	fifty per cent of the federal poverty level; and
18	[ <del>(4)</del> Meets the asset test; and
19	$\frac{(5)}{(4)}$ Is not a member of a retirement plan who is
20	receiving a benefit from the Medicare Modernization
21	Act.

1	(b) State pharmacy assistance program applicants who are
2	enrolled in any other public assistance program providing
3	pharmaceutical benefits, other than the Medicare Modernization
4	Act and medicaid, shall be ineligible for the state pharmacy
5	assistance program as long as they receive pharmaceutical
6	benefits from that other public assistance program, unless the
7	applicant is eligible for medicare. Residents who qualify for,
8	or are enrolled in, the Rx plus program shall be eligible for
9	the state pharmacy assistance program; provided that they meet
10	all other state pharmacy assistance program requirements.
11	(c) State pharmacy assistance program applicants who are
12	enrolled in a private sector plan or insurance providing
13	payments for prescription drugs shall be ineligible to receive
14	benefits from the state pharmacy assistance program.
15	(d) State pharmacy assistance program applicants must:
16	(1) Apply for the federal medicare part D pharmacy benefit
17	program;
18	(2) Apply for and accept all subsidies available under the
19	medicare part D pharmacy drug benefit; and
20	(3) Authorize the department on behalf of the applicant,
21	<u>to:</u>

1	(A) Request eligibility, coverage, and formulary
2	exceptions; and
3	(B) Appeal adverse determinations relating to
4	medicare prescription drug plan enrollment,
5	eligibility, subsidy eligibility, subsidy benefit
6	levels, coverage, and formulary exceptions."
7	SECTION 4. Section 346-344, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
8	amended to read as follows:
9	"§346-344 Benefits. (a) For persons [meeting] with
10	household incomes of not more than two hundred fifty per cent of
11	the federal poverty level, who meet the eligibility requirements
12	in section 346-343, the state pharmacy assistance program [may]
13	shall pay: [all or some of the co-payments required under the
14	federal medicare part D pharmacy benefit program, subject to the
15	sufficiency of funds in the state pharmacy assistance program
16	special fund, as determined by the department.
17	(1) The medicare prescription drug premium or a portion
18	thereof, up to one hundred twenty-five per cent of the
19	average premium charged by the part D plans available
20	in the state;

1	(2)	As to prescriptions covered by the medicare
2		prescription drug benefit, all enrollee costs,
3		including deductibles and copayments;
4	(3)	As to classes of medication excluded from coverage by
5		the medicare prescription drug benefit, all enrollee
6		costs; and
7	(4)	As to a prescription that has been denied for coverage
8		by the medicare prescription drug plan because the
9		pharmaceutical is not on the plan's formulary, all
10		enrollee costs if the department determines that
11		alternative medications available from the medicare
12		prescription drug plan would be less effective than
13		the prescribed medication or unsafe. The department
14		may seek reimbursement from the medicare prescription
15		drug plan and request and appeal a part D formulary
16		exception on behalf of the department and the
17		beneficiary.
18	(b)	For persons meeting the eligibility requirements in
19	section 3	46-343 with household incomes between one hundred fifty
20	and two h	undred fifty per cent of the federal poverty level, the
21	state pha	rmacy assistance program shall pay a portion of the

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payment of medicare part D on a sliding scale of between twenty-
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    five per cent and one hundred per cent of the average premium
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    charged by the medicare prescription drug plans available in the

         [<del>(b)</del>](c) The state pharmacy assistance program is the
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    payor of last resort [subject to the sufficiency of funds in the
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    state pharmacy assistance program special fund, as determined by

    the department].
         [(c)] (d) The state pharmacy assistance program shall be
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    funded with state appropriations [, including funds derived from
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    revenues to the State from rebates paid by pharmaceutical
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    manufacturers pursuant to section 346 342(g), and with savings
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    resulting from medicare prescription drug coverage for the

    medicaid dual eligible population."
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         SECTION 5. Section 346-345, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
    amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
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         "(b) Moneys in the state pharmacy assistance program
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    special fund may be used for:
         [(1) Reimbursement payments to participating pharmacies for
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              co-payments required under the federal medicare part D
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              pharmacy benefit program as provided to state pharmacy
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              assistance program participants;
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1 Payment of benefits under section 346-344; (1)The costs of administering the state pharmacy (2) 2 assistance program, including salary and benefits of 3 4 employees, computer costs, and contracted services as provided in section 346-342(d); and 5 Any other purpose deemed necessary by the department 6 (3) for the purpose of operating and administering the 7 state pharmacy assistance program. 8 All interest on special fund balances shall accrue to the 9 special fund. Upon dissolution of the state pharmacy assistance 10 program special fund, any unencumbered moneys in the fund shall 11 12 lapse to the general fund." SECTION 6. Act 264, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, is 13 14 amended by amending section 6 to read as follows: "SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2006; 15 16 provided that section 3 shall take effect on [July 1,] June 30, 17 2007." SECTION 7. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 18

and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2007.
