A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PRISONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 The legislature finds that there are currently SECTION 1. no substance abuse intervention or outreach programs in the 2 State's community correctional centers and correctional 3 facilities. While up to eighty-five per cent of the offender 4 population is involved with some degree of alcohol or substance 5 abuse, many offenders do not choose to seek treatment. 6 Intervention services that follow evidence-based practices 7 involve motivational therapies to help offenders become prepared 8 9 and motivated to seek treatment services. Intervention services include outreach, engagement, and special "induction" efforts to 10 clarify the needs and purpose of treatment and how it would 11 12 benefit individual needs.

13 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds to
14 establish substance abuse intervention and outreach programs in
15 the State's community correctional centers and correctional
16 facilities.

SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general

1 thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, for the 2 purpose of establishing substance abuse intervention programs in 3 the State's community correctional centers and correctional 4 facilities, as follows: 5 (1)Hawaii Community Correctional Center \$ (2)6 Kauai Community Correctional Center Ś 7 (3) Maui Community Correctional Center \$ 8 (4) Oahu Community Correctional Center Ś 9 (5) Womens' Community Correctional Center Ś 10 (6) Halawa Correctional Facility Ś 11 (7) Kulani Correctional Facility \$ 12 (8) Waiawa Correctional Facility \$ 13 The sum appropriated shall be expended by the department of 14 public safety for the purposes of this Act.
