RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 291-34, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 1 amended by amending subsection (c) to read as follows: 2 "(c) Length: 3 (1) No single motor vehicle or other power vehicle having a total overall length greater than forty-five feet, 5 including load, shall be operated or moved upon any 6 public road, street, or highway within the State, 7 except as provided in this subsection; (2) No truck-tractor and semitrailer having a total 9 overall length greater than sixty-five feet, including 10 load, shall be operated or moved upon any public road, 11 street, or highway, other than interstate highways and 12 13 certain qualifying federal aid highways as designated by the director of transportation, within the State, 14 except as provided in this subsection; provided that: 15

(A) For truck-tractors and semitrailers used for

agricultural purposes[7] or public utilities

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1			maintenance and service vehicles[, or articulated	
2			buses for public transit purposes], the total

- (vi) The projection does not extend more than four feet past the extremity of the piece of equipment, or if it extends more than four feet, an escort vehicle is provided by the owner or operator either to the front or to the rear of the projection to call attention to the projection; or
- (B) With respect to a motor vehicle, or a motor vehicle with attached trailer or semitrailer:
 - including the projection, is not greater
 than forty-five feet or the overall length
 of the motor vehicle with attached trailer
 or semitrailer, including the projection, is
 not greater than sixty feet except that this
 limitation on a motor vehicle with attached
 trailer or semitrailer, including the
 projection, shall not be applicable on
 interstate highways and certain qualifying

3	every such vehicle shall be equipped with a sufficient
4	number of clearance lamps upon the extreme ends of any
5	projecting load to clearly mark the dimensions of the
6	load."
