A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DENTAL CARE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. In 2006, the legislature appropriated funds to the department of human services to restore specific preventive 2 and restorative dental services for eligible persons twenty-one 3 4 years of age or older under the State's medicaid and QUEST 5 Previously, dental coverage for eligible adults was programs. limited to dental emergencies. According to a recent department 6 7 of health report, each eligible adult can receive specific preventive and restorative services, including dentures, 8 9 equivalent to \$500. However, this does not include coverage for 10 endodontic care, root canals, crowns, elective procedures, or 11 periodontal surgery. Also, partial and full dentures generally 12 cost more than \$500.

13 The purpose of this Act is to:

14 (1) Expand coverage under medicaid and QUEST to include
15 comprehensive dental care coverage for eligible
16 persons twenty-one years of age or older and to
17 appropriate funds to provide the additional coverage;

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1	(2)	Requires the department of health to establish a one-
2		year pilot program to gather information on hospital
3		dentistry for the developmentally disabled in the
4		county of Hawaii on usage, feasibility, and costs for
5		statewide application and appropriate funds; and
6	(3)	Establish a task force comprised of various
7		stakeholders to assist in developing ways to recruit
8		and retain dental care practitioners, licensed under
9		chapter 447 or 448, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to
10		support the provision of the expanded coverage.
11	SECT	ION 2. Chapter 346, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
13	and to read as follows:	
14	" 534	5- Dental care coverage. The department shall
15	provide c	omprehensive coverage to medicaid and QUEST recipients
16	for denta	l care administered by licensed practitioners under
17	chapter 4	47 or 448.
18	The	department shall administer this benefit in a manner
19	that meet	s federal requirements that are a condition of the
20	receipt o	f federal funds by the State.

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1	For purposes of this section, "comprehensive coverage"		
2	means the dental benefit as defined in the Hawaii state plan for		
3	medicaid."		
4	SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general		
5	revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so		
6	much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 to		
7	expand coverage under medicaid and QUEST to include		
8	comprehensive dental care coverage for persons twenty-one years		
9	of age or older.		
10	The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department		
11	of human services for the purposes of this Act.		
12	SECTION 4. The department of health shall establish a one-		
13	year pilot program in the county of Hawaii under which the		
14	department shall gather information on hospital dentistry for		
15	the developmentally disabled community in the county of Hawaii		
16	in order to determine usage, feasibility, and costs issues for		
17	application on a statewide basis.		
18	The department shall submit an interim report to the		
19	legislature not less than twenty days prior to the convening of		
20	the regular session of 2009 and a final report not less than		
21	twenty days prior to the convening of the regular session of		
22	2010.		
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1 SECTION 5. There is appropriated out of the general 2 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2008-2009 for 3 4 the pilot program to be established by the department of health 5 as provided in section 4. 6 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the dental 7 division of the department of health for the purposes of this 8 Act. 9 SECTION 6. (a) The department of human services shall 10 convene a task force composed of various stakeholders, including 11 the department of health, the Hawaii Dental Association, 12 interested dental care practitioners, at least one 13 representative of a federally qualified health center, and 14 advocates to assist in developing ways to recruit and retain dental care practitioners, licensed under chapter 447 or 448, 15 16 Hawaii Revised Statutes, to support the provision of the 17 expanded coverage under this Act. The task force shall submit a report to the 18 (b) legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of 19 the 2008 regular session. The task force shall cease to exist 20 upon the adjournment sine die of the 2008 regular session. 21 22 SECTION 7. New statutory material is underscored.

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SECTION 8. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008;
 provided that section 6 shall take effect upon its approval.
