A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO SENTENCING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to repeal the so-
- 2 called "three strikes" law adopted by the legislature in 2006.
- 3 The legislature finds that the law is overly broad because it
- 4 will lead to long prison terms for non-violent offenders, will
- 5 contribute to prison overcrowding and increased medical costs
- 6 for care of elderly inmates, is redundant of existing law, and
- 7 deprives the courts of the discretion needed to formulate
- $oldsymbol{8}$ appropriate, individualized sentences. Moreover, despite the
- 9 claim of law enforcement officials that its adoption was
- 10 urgently necessary to deter street criminals, the legislature
- 11 finds that this law has not been used once in six months.
- 12 SECTION 2. Act 81, Session Laws of Hawaii 2006, is
- 13 repealed.

14 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
