A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CAREGIVING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that over 190,000 2 individuals in the State provide regular care or assistance to 3 older adults age sixty and older. Many frail and disabled 4 elders depend on the care that they receive from caregivers, 5 many of whom are friends or relatives who are not paid for the 6 caregiving services that they provide. There are times when a 7 caregiver may unexpectedly become unable to provide the needed 8 caregiving services due to illness, an accident, or other 9 reasons. It is at these times that emergency respite care 10 becomes critical. Respite care is also important during the 11 evening when services or support is generally less available 12 from others.

The legislature further finds that the provision of respite care during the evening and on an emergency basis is important to ensure that frail and disabled elders receive necessary care when their caregivers are unavailable.

1 The purpose of this Act is to appropriate funds for the 2 executive office on aging to develop and implement a pilot 3 program to provide emergency and evening respite care for older 4 adults who are age sixty and older with physical or cognitive 5 disabilities. 6 SECTION 2. (a) The executive office on aging shall 7 develop and implement a pilot program to provide emergency and 8 evening respite care for older adults who are age sixty and 9 older with physical or cognitive disabilities. In developing 10 the pilot program, the executive office on aging shall consult 11 with the aging network. 12 The executive office on aging shall submit an interim 13 report, including any proposed legislation, to the legislature 14 no later than twenty days prior to the convening of the 2008 15 regular session, and shall submit a final report, including any 16 proposed legislation, to the legislature no later than twenty 17 days prior to the convening of the 2009 regular session. 18 SECTION 3. There is appropriated out of the general 19 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$, or so 20 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2007-2008, and 21 the same sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal

year 2008-2009, for the executive office on aging to develop and

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- implement a pilot program to provide emergency and evening
- 2 respite care for older adults pursuant to section 2.
- 3 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
- of health for the purposes of this Act.

This Act shall take on July 1, 2007. 5 SECTION 4.
