
A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO IOLANI PALACE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The Iolani palace is a historic treasure
- 2 officially recognized by the State of Hawaii. The palace served
- 3 as the seat of Hawaii's government from the days of the monarchy
- 4 through statehood, until the present Capitol building was
- 5 constructed. Through the years, the operation and maintenance
- 6 of the palace have relied only on private donations and small
- 7 state subsidies.
- 8 The purpose of this Act is to provide some relief for the
- 9 costs of operations and maintenance by exempting the palace from
- 10 the standards and conditions related to the receipt of funds
- 11 pursuant to chapter 42F, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
- 12 SECTION 2. Section 6E-35, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 13 amended to read as follows:
- "[+] \$6E-35[+] Iolani Palace. The official designation of
- 15 the palace of the former monarchs of Hawaii shall be Iolani
- 16 Palace.
- 17 The qualifying standards and conditions related to the
- receipt of funds contained in chapter 42F shall not apply to





- 1 funds received by the Iolani Palace; provided that if the palace
- 2 contracts with a recipient or provider, then the qualifying
- 3 standards, conditions, and other provisions of chapter 42F shall
- 4 apply to the recipient or provider and the contract."
- 5 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 7 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050.
