Dear Madam President and Members of the Senate:

Re: House Bill No. 2727 HD2 SD1 CD1

On July 8, 2008, House Bill No. 2727, entitled "A Bill for an Act Relating to Health Insurance" became law without my signature, pursuant to Section 16 of Article III of the State Constitution.

The purpose of this bill is to create a temporary Autism Spectrum Disorder Benefits and Coverage Task Force.

Although I understand why this measure is being proposed, this bill is premature. Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 196, which passed both the House and the Senate, requires the Auditor to submit a report on the impact of mandating coverage of the diagnosis and treatment of autism spectrum disorders for all policies and contracts, hospital and medical service plan contracts, medical service corporation contracts, and health maintenance organization plans and contracts issued after December 31, 2008. House Bill No. 2727 appears to unnecessarily duplicate the request to the Auditor in Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 196.

Furthermore, the proposed composition of the Task Force does not have the diversity of perspective provided by experts in the field, such as doctors or insurance analysts, necessary to facilitate thoughtful discussion on the subject matter.

For the foregoing reasons, I allowed House Bill No. 2727 to become law as Act 221, effective July 8, 2008, without my signature.

ACT 221

RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. (a) There is established in the department of 1 2 health for administrative purposes a temporary autism disorders spectrum benefits and coverage task force. The children with 3 4 special health needs branch shall assist the temporary task 5 force by providing a facilitator. The task force shall discuss 6 and seek input on the problems faced by parents of children with 7 autism and what can be done to ensure that proper health 8 benefits and services are provided through public and private 9 resources to address the special needs of children with autism, 10 including providing services involving applied behavioral analysis techniques. In addition, the task force shall research 11 12 health insurance coverage plans that cover autism spectrum 13 disorders in other states and develop a plan of services that health insurers should be mandated to cover. 14

15 (b) The task force shall consist of nine members as 16 follows:

17 (1) A member of the house of representatives appointed by18 the speaker of the house of representatives;



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1	(2)	A member of the senate appointed by the president of
2		the senate;
3	(3)	The superintendent of education or the
4		superintendent's designee;
5	(4)	The director of human services or the director's
6		designee;
7	(5)	The director of health or the director's designee;
8	(6)	The insurance commissioner or the insurance
9		commissioner's designee; and
10	(7)	Three members appointed by the governor from a list
11		submitted by the speaker of the house of
12		representatives and president of the senate, with each
13		member representing a different organization that
14		represents children with autistic spectrum disorder.
15	(c)	Members of the task force shall serve without
16	compensat:	ion and shall receive no reimbursement for expenses.
17	(d)	The task force shall submit a report of its findings
18	and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, to the	
19	legislature no later than twenty days prior to the convening of	
20	the regular session of 2009.

(e) The task force shall cease to exist on June 30, 2009.

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
SECTION 2. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2008, and 1 2 shall be repealed on June 30, 2009.
