Danny Solis

El Día de los Niños (Children's Day), also known as Día, is a celebration of children, families, and reading that culminates every year on April 30. The celebration emphasizes the importance of advocating literacy for children of all linguistic and cultural backgrounds.

In honor of Día de los Niños, join us Saturday, April 26 at 10:30 AM for an interactive poetry program for children with National Poetry Slam Champion Danny Solis!

Danny, often called the Poet Laureate of Albuquerque, brings the written word to life in an exciting interactive poetry show featuring classics by the likes of Langston Hughes and Mother Goose. (Children will

receive a book to take home. while supplies last.)

Danny Solis started writing poetry at the age of five and is especially successful in bringing poetry to children and younger audiences. He is a two time 'Burque Poetry Slam Champion and has been a part of two National

Championship Poetry Slam teams. Danny Solis is also featured prominently in the movie SlamNation (808.545 Slamnation).

All are welcome at our first Poetry Circle on Friday, April 25 at 3 PM, as we read and discuss the nature poems of two poets.


Join us as we compare and contrast poem

Jimmy Santiago Baca Along the Rio Grande




The Girls' Book: How to be the Best At Everything by Juliana Foster J 646.7 Foster



Several first books in new cozy mystery series can be found in the library this month.


First, Through a Glass, Deadly by Sarah Atwell is the first in the A Glassblowing Mystery series. Set in Tuscan, featuring Em Dowell as the artist and owner of Shards a glassblowing studio.





Corpse A Mantra for Murder Mystery series by Diana Killian begins with *Corpse Pose*. A.J. Alexander is the prime suspect in the murder of her aunt, the owner of Sacred Balance, a yoga studio. Her mother arrives from England to help her find her aunt's killer before she can become the next victim.

Filled with organizing tips, The Cluttered Corpse by Mary Jane Maffini is the second in the Charlotte Adams Mystery series. When professional organizer Charlotte is hired to put a stuffed animal collection in order she finds herself involved in a murder.



Sixth in the Scumble River Mystery Series is *Murder of a Chocolate-Covered Cherry* by Denise Swanson. Skye Denison, a school psychologist in Scumble River, enters a cooking challenge. When a contestant is found drowned in a chocolate fountain Skye finds there are too many suspects who could be the killer.
