## Kokopelli's Legacy

Cherry Hills Library is pleased to present an hour of music and history with Wolfs Robe, a 2008 Native American music Award Nominee and renowned flute player and educator, on Saturday, May 17th, starting at 2 PM.

During the Kokopelli's Legacy program, a performance/lecture, Wolfs Robe will cover some general flute history while playing antique flutes such as a Cherokee flute from the 1700's and historical reproduction flutes like his Anasazi flute. There is also a three-minute slide show during this pro-

gram showing photos of petroglyphs and ruins from the Southwest while Wolfs Robe plays flute accompaniment. The haunting sounds of the flutes will take listeners to a tranquil spot in the depths of themselves. He will begin each song with an explanation of the song and its origin so that what the listeners hear is brought to life.

Wolfs Robe will also play more modern Native American flutes and discuss the present and future of this amazing instrument. There will be time for questions and answers at the end of this musical journey.

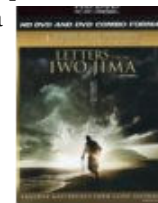


## A Night at the Movies for Adults
