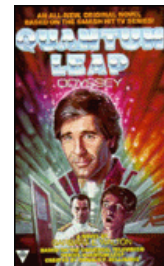

Jenna Rink is a typical preteen who wants to grow up fast. On her 13th birthday she gets



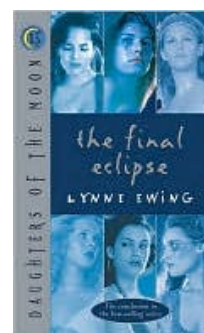

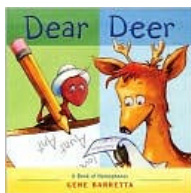

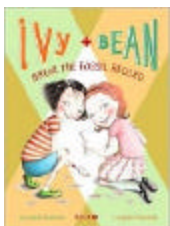

Meet the Robinsons

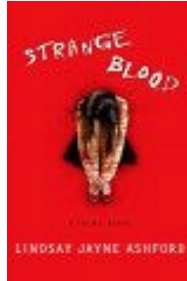

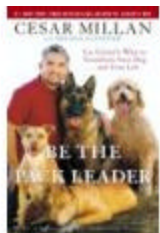

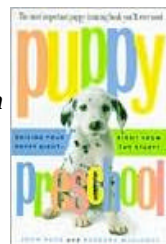
