A funnel cloud was observed for a 20 to 30 minute period by numerous law enforcement personnel and at least one trained spotter. The trained spotter reported an apparent brief touchdown. The event was witnessed mostly from nearby Wabash County at a distance of about 3 to 10 miles. No damage was located, possibly due to the sparsely populated farmland over which it occurred. Due to their distance from the funnel, eyewitnesses were not certain of the exact duration of the touchdown. This funnel cloud and tornado was produced by the same long-lived supercell that crossed the Rend Lake area of southern Jefferson and northern Franklin County.

Numerous trees were reported down throughout the county. The damage was reported mainly in northern, central, and western sections of the county. Some of the worst damage occurred in Kelso, where shingles were blown off roofs.

Numerous trees were blown down from just south of Delta to the Cape Girardeau city limits. At least one tree fell against a house, and a tree limb fell on a roof. A trained spotter estimated a 60 mph wind gust 1 mile northeast of Cape Girardeau. In the city of Cape Girardeau, numerous trees and power lines were down in the northwest section of the city. Trees landed on sheds, garages, and a vehicle. Cleanup was expected to take several days. About 6,400 customers in Cape Girardeau were without power at the peak of the outage.
