On August 4, 2007, Master Chief Niece assumed the duties of Command Master Chief to the United States Coast Guard Academy, New London, CT.

Master Chief Niece and joined the Coast Guard on December 12, 1982. Following Radioman "A" school, Petty Officer Niece began his career aboard the United States Coast Guard Cutter (USCGC) CHILULA (WMEC – 153) home ported at Atlantic Beach, NC, where he served as the Radioman of the Watch and as a Law Enforcement Boarding Team member. In 1985 he was transferred to Coast Guard Group New York, located on Governors Island, NY where he served as the assistant Radioman-in-Charge and as the Group Duty Officer. In 1989 he was transferred to the Coast Guard Atlantic Area Communications Center, where his duties included Systems Manager and watch supervisor. In 1991 he went back to North Carolina to serve aboard the USCGC DILIGENCE (WMEC 616) home ported in Wilmington, his primary duty was

Radioman-in-Charge, during his time onboard the Diligence he developed joint communication plans for both joint service and International operations.. His next assignment took him to Telecommunications Specialist School, Training Center Petaluma, CA as the Chief, TC "A" school. In 1996 he was selected as an instructor for the Coast Guard Chief Petty Officer Academy also located in Petaluma, CA during his time at the CPO Academy, he worked with members of all services and naval personal from numerous allied countries. In July 2000 he attended the US Army Sergeants Major Academy, Ft. Bliss, El Paso, TX as one of the two Coast Guard Students, upon graduation in May 2001 he was accepted for a Professional Military Instructor Position at the Air Force Senior Noncommissioned Officer Academy In April 2002 he was selected as Assistant School Chief for the Chief Petty Officer Academy and in June of 2005 assumed the duties of School Chief.
