The Office also represents the Attorney General in monitoring and supervising the activities of the Interagency Working Group on Alternative Dispute Resolution, a Presidentially established Task Force that promotes the use of dispute resolution throughout the Executive Branch. This enhancement, when combined with the resources provided by Congress in FY 2000, will fully fund the operational responsibilities of the Office. Twenty-two position are funded through reimbursements.</p>
